

Daily Choices

Famous artists depict Satan as a winged demon with goat horns and cloven hooves. If the devil really presented temptation to us in this obvious guise, we would easily be able to recognise and resist it. Sadly that is not the case. We tend to think of temptation as something that will lead us into a life of crime or immorality, but temptation is simply anything that threatens to take us away from God. Temptation does not come with all the easily recognisable trappings of Satan. More often or not temptation comes as an attractive choice. Satan presents for us easy ways out of our problems. Satan dresses up poor decisions as sensible options. Worse, the devil will help us to justify our poor decision making until we reach a point where we really cannot tell right from wrong.

Many of us fail to recognise temptation, and the reason we fail is because we don't really know who we are or what we're about. It's surprising that we can get so far on in years without being about to answer simple questions like "What are you doing for God?" "How would you like to be remembered?" The reason we struggle with questions like these is because as human beings we are governed hugely by self interest. Self interest is essential for survival and it's in all of us, but as Christians we have to put self interest on a back burner and put in the time and effort into defining who we really would like to be. Once we have achieved this, then the devil's temptations are suddenly crystal clear. After all, we can't be tempted away from our path in life if we've no idea what our path in life is. If we have no plan, we are hardly worth the devil's attention.

When we choose to give up something this Lent, perhaps it should be something that reflects the path we have chosen and the temptation we are trying to transcend. If we decide to give up red wine for instance, with the intention of dropping a couple of dress sizes, God won't be hugely impressed and the devil won't be remotely interested. If we give up wine because we have identified that it is stopping us from doing some important work of God's making, our Lenten journey will take on a life changing significance. Jesus gives us an important clue; "Away with you, Satan! for it is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him.'" When we make our daily choices ask, "Is this about me.... or is it about God?"

Resisting Temptation

There was a bowl of sweets sitting on the coffee table in the living room of Mary's house. Mary's mother noticed that she was looking at the sweets and said, "Now, don't you eat any sweets until after dinner or you will spoil your appetite." The sweets looked so good and the temptation was so great. "Surely just one little piece won't hurt - and mother will never know the difference," Mary thought to herself.



Have any of you ever had an experience like that? Here is another story which might sound familiar. "Put away your books and take out one sheet of paper and a pencil," the teacher said. "We are going to take our weekly spelling test." Johnny had an empty feeling in the pit of his stomach. He knew that they were going to have a spelling test today, but he watched TV last night instead of studying for the spelling test and he wasn't ready for the test. As the test began, Johnny looked around the room and realised that he had a clear view of Sally's paper. "It won't hurt if I look at Sally's paper just this once," Johnny thought to himself. "I promise — I'll never do it again and nobody will ever know."

All of us have faced temptations such as these, haven't we? Did you know that Jesus was tempted just as we are? The Gospel tells us that Jesus was led by the Holy Spirit into the desert where he was tempted by the devil for forty days. Do you know what Jesus did when the devil tempted him? He answered him with Scripture!

Jesus had not had anything to eat for forty days. He was hungry, and Satan knew he was hungry, so he said to him, "If you are really the Son of God, turn these stones into bread."

Jesus could have easily done what Satan suggested, but he didn't. Instead, he answered, "It is written, 'Man does not live by bread alone.'"

Then the devil took Jesus up to a high place and showed him the worldly kingdoms below. "All of this belongs to me," he said. "If you will bow down and worship me, I will give it to you."

FROM VISION TO REALITY

PLANNING APPROVED FOR

DUNAMASE COLLEGE / COLÁISTE DHÚN MÁSC

Planning permission has been granted for Dunamase College/Coláiste Dhún Másc 9 years after the school was first established. This new, purpose-built secondary school is designed to accommodate up to 1,000 students, providing much-needed, modern post-primary facilities for the community.

The approved development will deliver a permanent school building that reflects both the scale of local demand and the educational needs of young people now and into the future, including dedicated accommodation for an Aonad Lán-Gaeilge as part of the school's bilingual identity.

In acknowledging the significant news, Joe Cunningham Chief Executive of LOETB said 'Laois and Offaly ETB is delighted to see planning permission granted for the new Dunamase College building—an essential step in supporting the school's continued growth. Dunamase College provides a dynamic learning environment where strong academic standards are enriched by opportunities in music, STEM projects, and a broad array of extracurricular activities. The Board of Management has been instrumental in championing the school's vision, and their support has been vital in reaching this milestone. The new building will allow Dunamase College to continue delivering excellence for generations of students.'

In congratulating the school on this important

development Linda Tynan, Director of Schools with LOETB, said 'The approval of planning permission for the new Dunamase College building is a hugely positive development for the entire school community. I want to pay particular tribute to the senior management team and staff, whose work is defined not only by high expectations for teaching and learning, but also by the deep personal knowledge they have of every single student.'

Their commitment to ensuring that each young person is known, supported, and encouraged is at the heart of the school's success and will continue into the future.

Speaking about the announcement, Principal Dympna Kelly said: 'This decision marks a major step forward, moving the project from long-term planning to a tangible and exciting reality.'

This is a really significant moment for our school and for the wider community. This school reflects a genuine and pressing need for a purpose-built post-primary school in the area. I want to sincerely thank everyone who has supported the school throughout this journey – particularly our parents, students and staff – for their patience, trust and belief. Their encouragement and confidence in the school helped keep the need for this development front and centre over many years.

While the decision is about a building, it's really about the future and about creating the space where our students can- Grow, Develop, Learn - Fás, Forbairt, Foghlaim It will also be a welcome space where the Aonad Lán Gaeilge can continue to grow and thrive.

I would like to thank Laois County Council for their work and engagement throughout the planning process, along with the Department of Education, the LOETB, CEO Joe Cunningham, Director of Schools Linda Tynan, Director of OSD Pam Nolan and the architects MCOH, our local councillors and ministers, who played a key role in bringing the project to this important milestone.

While a new building is something to celebrate, we are very conscious that a school is about much more than bricks and mortar. Over the past nine years, a strong sense of community, care and ambition has been built, and this new facility will allow that work to continue in a space that truly reflects the quality of education being provided.

This is a significant and hopeful moment for everyone connected with the school. We now look ahead with optimism to the next stage of the project and to continuing to build our future together.

Time to Think...

Lent 2026 a time to grow and turn to the light



Lent 2026 is a sacred season that invites humanity to enter a time of prayer, fasting, almsgiving, and deeper conversion. In a world that can feel divided and noisy, Pope Leo XIV's message for Lent 2026, themed around "Listening and Fasting," offers a beautiful call to renewal. He encourages us to fast not only from food but from harmful words, unkindness, and division—choosing instead to listen attentively to God, to one another, and especially to those who suffer. By disarming our language and cultivating respect and hope, we make space for healing, peace, and the gentle presence of Christ's love. We live in an instant culture. Perhaps the greatest challenge of our time is to acquire the gift of patience. We don't do waiting very well. Easter eggs are readily available, since the end of December. The challenge of lent is to be countercultural. Perhaps a Lenten resolution for 2026, is to grow in the gift of patience. Some gifts are worth waiting for. Easter is one of them.

Lent is a season of reflection that leads us towards the three days of the Triduum, culminating with the celebration of Easter. It is a time to ask questions, a pause time on a journey, a time when we might re-examine the baggage we carry from month to month, maybe a time to lighten the load. A verse of a celebrated folk hymn, 'God's spirit is in my heart' has these words, "Don't carry a load in your pack, you don't need two shirts on your back, a workman can earn his own keep, can earn his own keep". That just about sums up the story of our journey. So, the signing of the cross on our foreheads, using ash from last year's burnt palms is a reminder of where we have come from and where we are headed and the ever-present need to take stock.

Lent is a time of return, when that which was lost is found again and a new beginning sought. The 'lost sheep' is a recurring symbol of our experience. A few years ago, I came across a solitary sheep cropping the roadside verge. It gave rise to these few lines.

"It had strayed beyond the barbed fence, head down, to graze the grass verge by the roadside.

Careless of traffic, a single sheep, carrying a rust-red stain of identity, had walked away from the field flock.

Slowly it cropped the road edge unhurried, waiting to be found". Saint Basil, known as the Great, was a fourth-century bishop of the Eastern Church who was known for his care for the poor.

He was also the writer of a monastic rule of life, which is still followed today by monks. He wrote a short piece on fasting, which can help us to a wider understanding of what it means: –

'Do not limit the benefits of fasting merely to abstinence from food, because a true fast means refraining from evil. Loose every unjust bond, put away your resentment against your neighbour, forgive him his offences. Do not let your fasting lead only to wrangling and strife. You do not eat meat, but you devour your brother; you abstain from wine, but not from insults. So, all the labour of your fast is useless.' (On Fasting, 1.10)

Maybe we could extend that idea a bit further. Why not do some of these?

Fast from anger and hatred. Give your family an extra dose of love each day.

Fast from judging others. Before making judgments, recall how we wish God to overlook our faults.

Fast from discouragement. Hold on to Jesus' promise that he has a mission for us in life. (Whatever you give up for Lent, don't let it be hope.)

Fast from complaining. When you find yourself about to complain, stop and recall some of the good things that happened to you in your life.

Fast from resentment and bitterness. Work on forgiving those who have hurt you.

Fast from spending too much money on yourself. Reduce your personal spending and spend instead on the poor, e.g. through Trócaire.

In Lent, don't just give up, take up. Take up prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Give up sin and take up repentance.

Lent is always an invitation to begin again. This is a time above all to build a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Lent can be a most profound and liberating personal journey. Building a relationship that gifts our personal lives to hope and indulge in a most resilient confidence. A confidence that reminds us, no matter what happens we are not alone. The light of Christ is brighter than any clouds of despair or uncertainty. St. Paul reminds us, "With God on our side who can be against Us"

Make the most of this sacred season as an opportunity to grow in our humanity. The more we accept our wounded selves the more we grow in wholesomeness and peace of mind. When this happens our vision and perspective become positive and bright. The following is a lovely daily prayer for lent...

I Will Turn

Lord, I will turn,
Turn my face towards you.

I will lay before you the desert areas I hide
And turn to soak in your refreshing words of life.

I will cast aside the barren, selfish pursuits
And turn to rest in the tranquil warmth of your love.

I will draw back from the harsh pull of media
And turn to bathe in the gentle power of your Spirit.

Lord, today I turn my face towards you.

I will turn

To soak in your words of life,
To rest in the warmth of your love,




