Saint Patrick

St. Patrick was born very probably in the early years of the fifth century in Roman colony of Britain. He was taken captive at the age of sixteen and brought to Ireland where he was sold as a slave. He tended herds on Slemish Mountain for six years. His captivity had a very positive effect on his spiritual life. He prayed many times each



day, his faith growing stronger and his love and reverence for God increasing. He escaped back home at the age of twenty-two It was obvious to him that God was calling him to return to convert the Irish. The voice of the Irish was calling him to come and walk among them once more. He studied probably in France, returned to Ireland as a bishop 457-61, or as early as 432 according to another tradition. His mission was not immediately greatly successful but eventually he would make a tremendous number of converts. Two writings survive: the Letter to Coroticus, a protest to the solders of a British prince who had killed some converts and sold them as slaves, and his Confession written near the end of his life, showing him as one living by the faith he preached and allowing Christ to direct his whole life. He died 491, though again other dates have been suggested, 480 or as early as 461.

ST. PATRICK

As a teenager, Patrick was captured by Irish raiders and forced into slavery for six years. During this time he learned the language and customs of the Irish people. He also grew close to God. After the six years, he escaped and made his way back to his family. Then he decided that the people of Ireland needed him. So, he began to learn the Bible and train for mission work. Once he was ready, he returned to Ireland and preached to the people for 40 years before he died. As he converted the Irish, he made disciples out of them. Many of his followers went on to become renowned religious leaders as well.

Saint Patrick left behind a great example for us to follow. He could have hated the people who stole him from his family, but he knew

that they needed God's love. He loved his enemies and wanted them to know God like he did. In addition to converting many, he spent time training them to lead others. We need to learn from his example of not only converting the lost but training them in God's Word after they convert. Patrick's love, forgiveness, service, and leadership provides us with an excellent example to emulate.

Now that we have received the Sacrament of Confirmation we are now full members of the Church.

Any other Sacrament you might receive - even Holy Order - does not make you any more a member of the Church than those who have received the sacraments of initiation. To be a member of the Church means to be part of Christ's Body.



Anointing with Chrism:

Each person that was confirmed is anointed with Chrism. This anointing shows that the Holy Spirit is strengthening them to work for Jesus Christ. Being confirmed means being strengthened. The chrism is preserved in a small silver vessel. The Bishop or Priest dips his thumb into the chrism. He then traces the Sign of the Cross on the forehead of the person being confirmed while he says the words, "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit".





In Confirmation, God's sign or mark of love is imprinted or sealed on the person being confirmed. God's sign can never be removed.

We say that in Confirmation we are sealed or marked forever when we are given the Gift of the Holy Sprit.

TIME TO THINK!

ST. PATRICK AND FAITH

On St. Patrick's Day we celebrate our Irishness and our faith. For so long in our history they have been intertwined, perhaps at times identified. As a result we may have been tempted to take our faith for granted. Admittedly we did not have to fight for it or die for it as our ancestors did. They were challenged by their faith and responded generously to that challenge.

Today, Irish people all over the world and we here at home rejoice in the new opportunities which are available in our country - education, employment and a good quality of life. Indeed many of our exiles will tell you that they regret the fact that these opportunities were not available to them before they emigrated.

In the past the challenge to our faith came from outside of ourselves - from Penal Laws and from oppressive regimes. Today the challenge is not so obvious and it comes from within ourselves. Faith is not something that has myths of compartmentalisation; rather it impinges on all areas of human living. Today there is probably no area of life in which faith is not being challenged and in which it does not have a significant contribution to make.

As individuals and families, whether in our work, socialising, education or whatever, our faith impinges or we can refuse to allow it to do so.

At times we misinterpret and misunderstand the nature of faith. Great faith is not a faith that walks in the light and knows no darkness. Real faith perseveres in spite of God's seeming silence.

When one considers the obstacles with which Patrick contended - taken captive from his own people and his home, slavery on Slieve Mish, eventual escape and yet prepared to return as a missionary and preach Christ's Gospel to those who had held him captive.

The wholeheartedness and single mindedness of Patrick are clear pointers to his faith. He is a man of flesh and blood whose whole life was fed on faith in God's love. Faith must have been a struggle for him, as it is for you and I. In the experience of slavery it must have been tempting for him to abandon faith and yield to despair. Yet he recognised his real helplessness and turned to God as a helper and a true friend.

Slavery in the 21st century takes on a more sinister and subtle form. Work, pleasure, comfort, the celebrity status.

Almost unnoticed God can be excluded and pushed out to the margins of life in a busy competitive world. With so many voices clambering for our attention we have to make an effort to keep the lines of communication open with God in prayer and in our participation at Mass and the sacraments.

In a confused and complex culture we need a compass to provide us with a sense of direction, enabling us to



cope with and respond to the various challenges which meet us every day. I am convinced that faith, properly understood and genuinely lived can provide us with such a compass. Faith can enable us to see beneath and beyond the situations in which we find ourselves. Just as in Patrick's life, faith made it possible for God to enter, so in our lives faith makes it possible for God to become involved in our busy world and our hectic activity.

As we celebrate St. Patrick's Day I take this opportunity to wish you a very happy celebration and pray that the faith that Patrick brought to our shores will sustain all of us in challenging times.


St. Patrick's Breastplate is a popular prayer attributed to one of Ireland's most beloved patron saints. According to tradition, St. Patrick wrote it in 433 A.D. for divine protection before successfully converting the Irish King Leoghaire and his subjects from paganism to Christianity. (The term breastplate refers to a piece of armor worn in battle.)

PART ONE THE INTRODUCTORY RITES

WE COME TOGETHER TO MEET THE LORD

SUNDAY AS THE HIGHPOINT OF OUR WEEK

From the very beginning, the early Christian communities realised the importance of Sunday. It is the day of Jesus'

Resurrection, a day of joy and rest, as well as charity. Sunday is the Lord's Day, the day when we are called to remember what God has done and continues to do for us. This, then, is the day the Lord's people are called to keep holy, together. The observance begins with the evening of the preceding day.

SUNDAY - EUCHARIST - COMMUNITY

Early Christians did what Jesus had asked them to do; they gathered and celebrated the meal Jesus had shared with them, the Eucharist. We also know this as the Mass. This gathering of the community on a Sunday to celebrate the Eucharist gave rise to a basic principle of the Church: *There can be no Sunday without the Eucharist and no Eucharist without an assembly of the faithful.*

This principle endures to this day. It led Voltaire to declare, "If you want to kill Christianity, you must abolish Sunday." As members of the Christian community, we are each called to gather with the rest of our faith community on a Sunday to celebrate the Eucharist. The Sunday Mass is the place where we gather as a parish, as a community, as the People of God. This is at the heart of the life of the Church. It is the highpoint of our Christian life, where God nourishes us to go out and live as Christians.

A Glossary of Terms

Church- those called together or gathered by God: *ecclesia*Eucharist – Derived from the Greek word 'to give thanks'. It can refer to the consecrated Bread and Wine, as well as the whole of the Mass

Order of Mass – The texts and sequence of the Mass that does not change from week to week

The Roman Missal – The ritual book that contains all the prayers and rubrics (instructions) to be observed in the celebration of Mass in any situation.

Assembly – another name for the congregation. It highlights that God calls us together as one body of people Presider – the priest celebrant who leads the celebration of Mass

CALLED BY GOD, WE GATHER WITH CHRIST AND ONE ANOTHER: all are welcome, all are wanted, all are needed

"We Christians have been called one-by-one: no one of us is Christian by pure chance. No one."

As baptised members of the Church, we are part of a faith community called by God. When we gather for Mass on a Sunday we do so in response to God's personal invitation to each one of us. Ever before the Mass begins, each of us is called, welcome, wanted and needed.

We are not here to simply 'get Mass'. As Catholics, on a Sunday we are obliged and are called to join with the rest of our community to offer our worship, our praise and thanksgiving to God. We are here to *celebrate* Mass – this inserts us into the heart of the Mass, calling all of us to be *active participants* rather than silent spectators. That is why we need to come ready to pray, ready to be attentive to the words and actions that unfold in our midst.

And when we gather in the name of the Lord we know that Christ is with us. For Christ told us where two or three are gathered in his name that he is there. (Matthew 18:20) From the beginning of Mass, therefore, we are invited to welcome Christ present in his people. Look around next time you are at Mass and see the face of Christ in those who have gathered with you!

THE PURPOSE OF THE INTRODUCTORY RITES

Each of us, individually or with our families, make our way to Sunday Mass. As we enter the Church, we bless ourselves with holy water as a reminder of our common baptism. We may greet friends and strangers who have come with a common purpose. Taking our place, we genuflect towards the tabernacle reverencing the presence of Christ in the reserved Sacrament and we pause for a moment of silent prayer, preparing ourselves to enter into this great act of worship with the rest of our faith community.

The Mass itself begins with the Introductory Rites - a series of words and actions that begins with the *Entrance Procession*, and its accompanying hymn, and ends with the Opening Prayer or *Collect*.

The function of the Introductory Rites is to enable us as a community, coming from different places and with a variety of concerns, to become aware of ourselves as a gathered assembly; establishing a unity or communion among us and preparing us to listen to the Word of God and to celebrate the sacrament.


Exploring the Introductory Rites

- * Entrance Procession and Hymn: This procession of the priest celebrant and ministers through the body of people is a visible reminder to us that we gather as the Body of Christ. Christ is with us and we stand together as a sign of welcome and reverence for his presence among us. Our hymn unites us in one voice of praise. The priest reverences the altar with a bow and a kiss as the altar is a symbol of Christ at the heart of this assembly.
- * GREETING: All make the sign of the Cross and the priest celebrant greets us from the Chair in words taken from Scripture. These words remind us that in our gathering, the God of the Trinity, the God of grace, love and peace, is with us and working upon us through this celebration.
- * PENITENTIAL ACT: Before we enter deeper into the Mass we take one more moment to prepare ourselves, using one of three prayer options given to us in the Missal. Conscious that we all likely come with things we would like to change in our lives, behaviours we would like to be different, in the Confiteor we acknowledge before our brothers and sisters that we have sinned, and we ask for their prayers. But even greater than our sin, we trust in the enduring mercy and love of God, and so we can pray in confidence, Lord, have mercy.

 On some Sundays, especially in Easter Time, in place of the usual Penitential Act, the blessing and sprinkling of water to recall our baptism may take place.
- * GLORIA: On Sundays outside of Lent and Advent, on solemnities and feasts, the *Gloria* is sung or recited. In this joyful hymn of praise the gathered assembly unites with the heavenly choirs. Within this hymn we recall the five actions of the Mass we are each called to: we are here to praise, bless, adore, glorify and thank our God.
- * OPENING PRAYER / COLLECT: The Introductory Rites conclude with an opening prayer, called the Collect. This prayer gathers (or collects) all our prayers into one prayer of the day. It has a four-fold pattern of 1) an invitation from the priest celebrant to the assembly to pray, 2) a brief silence to gather the prayers of our hearts into one, 3) the prayer itself proclaimed by the priest celebrant and 4) our assent to the prayer in our 'Amen'. The silence within this prayer can help create a sense of unity among the assembly. Like all our prayers in the liturgy, we make our prayer to God the Father, through Christ and in the Holy Spirit. This can be a timely reminder to us that the celebration of the Mass is the action of Christ and of the people of God, united in common worship.
