Arrangements due to the Coronavirus

The following instructions take into consideration the new norms issued by the Irish government which came into force at 18.00hrs on Thursday 12th and to last up to and including Sunday 29th March.

The restriction that indoor gatherings cannot exceed 100 people means that, with regret, we have to cancel our Sunday Masses. No public Sunday Mass will be celebrated in any of our Churches or at our Mass centre at Scoil Bhríde.

The motivation for these new restrictive measures is a sense of care for the common good and especially for those most vulnerable. Each Christian community should be acutely aware of the responsibility to care for those who are most at risk. For example, even where it may not be appropriate to visit the elderly, a simple telephone call to enquire about their needs could mean so much to them.

Daily Masses:

Mass will be celebrated in our Parish Church at 7.30am and 7.30pm each weekday (excluding Tuesday 17th March) in the hope that congregations are less than 100 people.

The Woman at the Well

Most of you probably play some kind of sports. What kind of sports do you play?

Whether you play sports or just play hard, you know that when you're exercising, it's very important to take in plenty of liquids.

The question is: What kind of liquids should you drink?

Ordinary water, of course, is a good choice, but when you go to the shops, the shelves are full of all kinds of sports drinks, energy drinks, and flavoured water. It's hard to know what's best.

The advertisement for one popular brand of sports drink says, "It's better than water, juice, or any other drink. It gives your body what it is thirsty for! It gets you going and keeps you going."

Wow! They have me convinced, but one thing I've noticed: In all the claims made by sports drinks, not once have they ever claimed that if you would drink their product, you would NEVER be thirsty again. If somebody had something that would do that, they would really have something, wouldn't they? Well, Jesus claimed to have that very thing!

One day Jesus was walking through a town in Samaria. He was hot and tired so he sat down beside a well to rest. A woman came to the well to get some water and Jesus asked her if she would give him a drink. The woman was surprised that Jesus spoke to her because Jews would not usually speak to Samaritans.

Jesus told her that He could give her living water!

She didn't understand what He was talking about so she said, "You don't even have anything to get water in, how can you give me living water?"

Then Jesus said, "Whoever drinks from the water from this well will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst again."



TIME TO THINK!

CASES OF CORONAVIRUS RISING DAILY -THE CHALLENGES.....

With cases of coronavirus rising each day, the challenges Technology posed to health services, workplaces, vital national a useful tool to serve infrastructure, and the social and communal fabric of our lives come to the forefront of our attention. It is already apparent that the economic impact of the virus as it whom it is inadvisable spreads will be felt worldwide, with growth forecasts to be in contact with downgraded and travel and tourism industries braced for a significant hit. The full effect on human life, already shouldn't unnecessarily significant, is yet unknown.

What is clear is that, as a society, we will likely experience significant upheaval as a result of this health crisis. In 2009/10 the swine flu pandemic (the last virus to be officially termed a pandemic by the World Health Organisation) was a very mild strain of flu and despite its global spread had low morbidity rates compared to seasonal flu. Early indications suggest that the novel coronavirus is significantly more dangerous, especially to those with underlying health conditions, and is spread more easily.

The idea of containing a disease in our major cities is certainly a challenge. The connections we have around the country and across the world make tackling the spread of the virus more difficult, especially if we are trying to mitigate the economic consequences.

Rodney Stark in his book The Rise of Christianity looked at how the response of the early church to the plagues in Rome was integral to the growth of the church. He quotes the early bishop Dionysius saying: "Most of our brother Christians showed unbounded love and loyalty, never sparing themselves and thinking only of one another. Heedless of danger, they took charge of the sick, attending to their every need and ministering to them in Christ, and with them departed this life serenely happy; for they were infected by others with the disease, drawing on themselves the sickness of their neighbours and cheerfully accepting their pains. Many, in nursing and curing others, transferred their death to themselves and died in their stead..."

It's not that Christians should throw sense to the wind or ignore advice. It's certainly not that the communion cup contains special powers that prevent germs being transmitted. But it is a determination that in a world gripped by fear of what might be, the church should be the non-anxious presence that witnesses to the peace of Christ that lives in us.

Many communities will feel the impact if more stringent restrictions on travel and gathering are placed in coming weeks and months. Proposals to close schools will affect parents being able to work. If towns are put into lockdown as has occurred in Italy, panic buying and food shortages may occur. Let us be the non-anxious presence that speaks of the Prince of Peace and His wonderful coming kingdom.

As Christians we should be sensible, but we should continue meeting, we should continue serving our community, and we should continue to share the good news of Jesus with our friends, family, colleagues and neighbours.

can those who are unable or unwilling, or for other people, but we distance from those in greatest need.

ourselves In many communities

the church is the first to arrive and the last to leave. It notices challenges before statutory services are mobilised and it remains committed when funding might dry up. The church is the embodied witness to the resurrected Christ, through the lives of men and women committed to following in His steps and living in His likeness.

I realise the irony of calls for isolation, or the novel idea of 'self-isolation'. In places with so many people around we can still be isolated, cut off from human connection and starved of relationship. We should not be careless or aid the spread of the virus, but we should think of our motivation. Are we formed by fear of what might be or fuelled by hope of who God is and what He can do? How can we speak peace to the panic buyers of anti-bacterial gel and the afraid-to get-on-the-train commuters?

And we must pray. Pray for medical professionals, and government decision makers, for those who are already isolated and concerned about cutting off vital connections. Pray for people who are at greater risk of more significant consequences of becoming infected. Pray for miracles. And pray for the witness of the church of Jesus Christ.



JESUS IS THE LIVING WATER WHO GIVES US ETERNAL LIFE

The celebration of baptism: Gathered around the font



Having welcomed the children and their families at the door of the church, listened to God's Word and anointed the children with the strengthening Oil of Catechumens, the children are brought to the font for baptism. This is what we are here to do, to baptise these children so that they may share in the faith of the Church and have new life with

Christ through water and the Holy Spirit. The font is only used to welcome new members. Just as Jesus went down into the waters of the Jordan and heard God say, 'This is my beloved on whom my favour rests', so every child brought to the font is a loved child of God.

Before baptism a PRAYER OVER THE WATER is said. This prayer draws us into the depth of God's power and love at work in our human story. It recalls the great moments of salvation history such as the water at the dawn of creation, the great flood, the exodus through the Red Sea, the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan, the water that flowed from the side of the crucified Christ. Together, the water and the prayer, point to a God who calls us to be a new creation, calls us to a life of holiness, forgives our sins, frees us from the many

'slaveries' of the world, gifts us with the Holy Spirit, calls us to be generous in sharing this good news with others, who has created us in God's own likeness and who calls us to share in Christ's resurrection. From this it is clear that baptism is not a casual step on our life journey but is one that firmly sets us on a definite path in life to live in a particular way.



Sacraments are not magic! To reach their fullness, sacraments presume faith and faith presumes an ongoing and growing relationship with God. The practice of our faith that flows from baptism is a daily habit. Along the way it needs guidance and support to grow and flourish. This is what happens in the family faith is nourished by prayer but also by the Christian values and beliefs that guide a family as they live and grow together. This is why the PROFESSION OF FAITH is a necessary step in the celebration of baptism. In the case of infant baptism,

parents and godparents make this profession as part of accepting the responsibility and the privilege of sharing their faith with these children. The profession of faith is two-fold, involving a renunciation of sin and a profession of faith. This highlights that when we turn towards God we also actively and consciously turn away from evil in our lives. The Profession of Faith contains the central elements of our Christian faith. It professes what we believe

as an individual Christian and together as a Church. It is this faith that we renew our commitment to every Easter, having done our Lenten preparation.

Now we are ready for the BAPTISM of the children in water and in the name of the Trinity - Father, Son and Holy Spirit. These children are now part of the family of God. This is the water of life that washes us clean from sin and the human condition; this is the water that leads us into a new life, a new relationship with God and with the Christian community.



Weekly Gospel Link



The Woman at the Well This much loved Gospel is a pivotal reminder as we make our Lenten journey that Jesus is the source of our life. It is the first of three Gospels from John which we listen to in Lent that draw on central symbols in baptism - in this instance the symbol of water.

In the encounter between Jesus and the woman we see God's mercy in action. The woman is an outsider, left to draw water at the hottest part of the day, alone. Jesus actively reaches out to her, ignoring the social norms of the time that would keep her in isolation. And in doing so the woman, and us in turn, come to know Jesus as the source of our life, as the living water that dwells within us, as our saviour.

As we welcome this reading into our hearts this Lent, may we have the same experience as this woman. May we welcome Jesus into the very circumstances of our life to heal us and bless us, may we see Jesus as our saviour who brings us to eternal life, and may we bring this good news to

Each one of us can identify with the Samaritan woman: Jesus is waiting for us, especially in this Season of Lent, to speak to our hearts, to my heart. Let us pause a moment in silence, in our room or in a church or in a separate place. Let us listen to his voice which tells us "If you knew the gift of God...". Pope Benedict XVI

Exploring a Practice for Lent:

The Works of Mercy

Pope Francis reminds us that the Christian life involves the practice of the traditional seven corporal and seven spiritual works of mercy. These works have a long history in the Church and find their origins in the words and actions of Jesus. If we look at the works of mercy as a whole, we see that the object of mercy is human life itself and everything it embraces. The catechism puts it succinctly when it says, 'The works of mercy are charitable actions by which we come to the aid of our neighbour in their spiritual and bodily necessities.' (Par 2447)

In Lent we are reconnecting once more with how to live our baptism. It is a great time, then, to look at these works as ways in which we can actively and practically respond to Jesus' invitation to us to love our neighbour. The Corporal Works are to: Feed the hungry; give drink to the thirsty; clothe the naked; shelter the homeless; visit the sick; visit those imprisoned; and bury the dead. The Spiritual Works are to: Counsel the doubtful; instruct those lacking knowledge of faith; correct sinners; comfort the sorrowful; forgive injuries; bear wrongs patiently; and pray for the living and the dead.




Due to the Coronavirus restrictions our Bingo will be suspended until after the prescribed period of 29th March.

- The practice of shaking hands on greeting and departure should be suspended.
