Pope for Lent: With God there is always a dialogue of the heart In the Papal Message for Lent 2020, Pope Francis stresses the importance of prayer.

Pope Francis stresses the importance of prayer as a means of responding to God's love, "which always precedes and sustains us". We are also called to hear and respond to the Word of Jesus, in order to experience "the mercy He freely gives us".

God is always engaged in a "dialogue of salvation with us", despite our weaknesses and failings, the Pope says. This desire to save us "led the Father to burden His Son with the weight of our sins, thus, in the expression of Pope Benedict XVI, 'turning of God against Himself' (Deus caritas est, 12)".

#### Faith for the Journey

When we do something for the very first time it can be a little bit scary. Do you remember your very first day at school? Your mother probably went in with you to help you find your room and meet your teacher. When you got on a bicycle for the first time, someone probably walked along beside you and helped hold you up at the very beginning. That gave you confidence and soon you were riding on your own. When you went swimming for the first time, you didn't just go out and jump in the pool, did you? No, there was someone with you to hold you up until you could swim on your own. It really helps if we have someone we trust to be with us when we are about to do something we have never done before.

In the first reading today, Abram was a bit sacred, when God told him to leave everything behind and to move to a new country. He didn't even tell him where this country was. He just said, "Go to the land that I will show you." They didn't know where they were going or what they would

find when they got there. They trusted God - like we trust our parents to help us do new things. So, even though they were a bit scared, they left everything and set out on the journey to the place that God showed them. It took many years, but God was with them and he led them to their new home. How about you, do you ever take a journey into the unknown? Sure you do. Just about every day we

face things which we have never done before. They may be a bit scary, but we know that God is with us, just as he was with Abram. We just have to trust him to lead the way.



Father, sometimes we are afraid to go where we have not gone before. Help us to remember that you are with us wherever we go. Amen.

Now that we have received the Sacrament of Confirmation we are now full members of the Church.

Any other Sacrament you might receive - even Holy Order - does not make you any more a member of the Church than those who have received the sacraments of initiation. To be a member of the Church means to be part of Christ's Body.



Anointing with Chrism:

Each person that was confirmed is anointed with Chrism. This anointing shows that the Holy Spirit is strengthening them to work for Jesus Christ. Being confirmed means being strengthened. The chrism is preserved in a small silver vessel. The Bishop or Priest dips his thumb into the chrism. He then traces the Sign of the Cross on the forehead of the person being confirmed while he says the words, "Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit".





In Confirmation, God's sign or mark of love is imprinted or sealed on the person being confirmed. God's sign can never be removed.

We say that in Confirmation we are sealed or marked forever when we are given the Gift of the Holy Sprit.

### TIME TO THINK!

#### BLESSED CARLO ACUTIS. . .. PATRON OF THE INTERNET

I am greatly taken by the life story of Carlo Acutis, a young, talented and deeply spiritual teenager whose life story is a real example of Christian Hope. Carlo was born in London May 3rd, 1991, to Italian parents who soon returned to Milan. He was a pious child, attending daily Mass, frequently praying the rosary, and making weekly confessions.

Exceptionally gifted in working with computers, Carlo Acutis, developed a website which catalogued Eucharistic miracles. This website was the genesis of The Eucharistic Miracles of the World, an international exhibition which highlights such occurrences.

Acutis stated that "To always be close to Jesus, that's my life plan. I'm happy to die because I've lived my life without wasting even a minute of it doing things that wouldn't have pleased God.'

Carlo Acutis died at the age of 15 in Monza, near Milan, Oct. 12th, 2006, of a galloping leukaemia, leaving in the memory of all those who knew him a great feeling of emptiness and great admiration for his brief but intense testimony of authentic Christian life,

From the day he received his First Communion at the age of 7, he never missed an appointment with daily Holy Mass. He always tried, either before or after the Eucharistic celebration, to pause before the Tabernacle to adore the Lord, always truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. Our Lady was his great confidant and he never failed to honour her by reciting the Holy Rosary every day. Carlo's modern and up-to-date ways combined perfectly with his profound Eucharistic life and Marian devotion, which helped to make him that very special boy who everyone admires and loves.

To quote Carlo's own words: "Our goal must be the infinite and not the finite. The Infinity is our homeland. We are always expected in Heaven". Another phrase of his was: "All people are born as originals but many die as photocopies". To move towards this goal and not "die as photocopies" Carlo said that our compass must be the Word of God, that we have to measure up to constantly. But to reach such a lofty goal very special measures are necessary: the Sacraments and prayer. In particular, Carlo placed the Sacrament of the Eucharist at the centre of his life and he called it "my highway to Heaven".

Carlo was very gifted with everything related to the world of computers so that both his friends and adults with computer engineering degrees considered him a genius. Everyone was amazed at his ability to understand the secrets of computers that are normally only accessible to those who have specialised university degrees. Carlos' interests involved computer programming, film editing, website creation, editing and laying out small publications, to helping those most in need especially children and the elderly.

This young believer of the Diocese of Milan was a mystery, who before he died was able to offer his suffering up for the Pope and the Church.

"To be always united with Jesus, this is my plan of life". These few words Carlo Acutis, the boy who died of leukaemia, said outline the distinctive feature of his short life: living with Jesus, for Jesus, in Jesus. (...) "I am happy to die because I lived my life without wasting even a minute of it on anything unpleasing to God". And Carlo asks of us the same thing: he asks us to spread the Gospel through our lives, so that each of us can be a beacon to light the journey of others.

Carlo, like many adolescents of our time was busy at school, with his friends, and for his young age was an expert in computers. In the midst of all his commitments he encountered Jesus Christ.

Carlo Acutis became a witness to the Risen Christ, he entrusted himself to the Virgin Mary.

Carlo lived a life of grace sharing his overwhelming experience of God with

He received the Eucharist every day, he attended Holy Mass devoutly daily and would pause for hours in adoration before the Blessed Sacrament.

experience and Christian maturity testify to the truth of Benedict XVI's words in the Apostolic Exhoration Sacramentum Caritatis: the sacrifice of the Mass



and Eucharistic Adoration strengthen, support, develop love of Jesus and the availability to ecclesial service.

Carlo also nourished a special devotion to Our Lady, to whom he faithfully recited the Rosary, and feeling her motherly love, he offered her acts of mortification.


This teenager sociologically similar to his school mates, was an authentic witness that the Gospel can be lived fully even by a teenager.

In his short life, oriented to that encounter with Jesus, was like a light not only to shine on the path of those who knew him, but also of those who will come to know his story. I am sure that this first biography of Carlo Acutis, edited by Nicola Gori, with his well known ability to involve the reader, will help today's adolescents, so problematic and so conditioned by the Mass Media, to reflect on the meaning of life and on the Gospel values to realise it fully.

Looking at this teenager as their peers, who felt attracted by Christ's friendship, and for this very reason experienced a truer joy, our children will be put in touch with a life experience that has not taken anything away from the wealth of young teenage years, but has enhanced them even more.

Carlo's witness to the Gospel is not only an incentive for today's adolescents, but it also helps parish priests and teachers to question themselves about the value of the formation they give to young people of our parish communities and how to make this formation effective and incisive.

### A Weekly Bulletin for Lent Part Two

WE ARE CALLED TO RECOGNISE, LISTEN TO AND FOLLOW JESUS

The Liturgy of the Word and Anointing with Oil of Catechumens: What do they tell us about baptism and our faith?



As we make our journey to renew our baptism at Easter, in these bulletins we are reflecting on the celebration of baptism itself and what it tells us about our faith. Let's take a look now at the Liturgy of the Word.

There can be no celebration of the sacraments without the proclamation of the Word of God. This suggests that scripture is central to our faith. And this is

true. For through the texts of scripture God speaks to us today. To listen to God means turning to the whole of the bible and reading it in a spirit of prayer and openness to God's voice. Then we will hear God's message to us personally and as a Church.

St Jerome wrote that ignorance of scripture is ignorance of Christ while the Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us that to be a Christian means to unite oneself ever more deeply with the life of Christ. If we want to do that, if we want to come to know and be followers of Christ, then we have to read and live the Gospels. In them we get to meet Christ, the Word of God, who has come to speak with us, in his own words and by his own life. 'Only when we meet the living God in Christ do we know what life is...There is nothing more beautiful than to be surprised by the Gospel, by the encounter with Christ.' (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI)

# What about the Anointing with the Oil of Catechumens?

The Liturgy of the Word concludes with our intercessions to God and a litany of the saints – reminding us that God will continually listen to our prayers and that on our Christian journey we have the witness and support of the saints who have gone before us, having lived lives of faith. Before baptism a child is anointed with the Oil of Catechumens (the name for those preparing for baptism). This is olive oil blessed by the Bishop. The prayer that precedes the anointing reminds us that the world we are born into is one where the condition of sin and its consequences exist. The Church calls this Original Sin and we see its presence in our world every day

in terrible events. But through the love and grace of God, we are freed from the reality of that condition. The prayer and the anointing express this truth and God's care and protection of us at every step in life's journey. From our baptism onwards we are strengthened to live as God wants us to through the power of Christ and the Holy Spirit.

#### Weekly Gospel Link



In the Transfiguration we see the three disciples with Jesus on a high mountain – often a place in scriptures where God makes a special revelation to people. Here they have a moment of insight into the reality of who Jesus is and they experience both joy and fear, though Jesus tells them not to be afraid.

This Gospel reading comes to us near the beginning of Lent. It puts Jesus at the centre of our Lenten journey.

Lent is our opportunity to experience the joy of discovering again who Jesus is, to listen to him and to follow him. And we do not need to be afraid. See kandle.ie for weekly reflections on the Lenten Sunday readings for group, family or individual use.

#### Exploring a Practice for Lent:

#### Stations of the Cross

What we know as the Stations of the Cross (or the Way of the Cross) has its origins in the practice in the early church of pilgrims walking in the footsteps of Jesus' passion in Jerusalem. Along the way they would stop to pray at places where a significant event is believed to have occurred. It is thought that in the Middle Ages the Franciscans brought this tradition to Europe. This made it possible for the faithful who could not travel to Jerusalem to experience in a virtual way the Stations of the Cross by following a signposted path around the inside and/or outside of the church.

From the 18<sup>th</sup> century all Catholic churches were permitted to erect the Stations of the Cross within the church building or in the grounds of the church. This led to the visual depictions we see in our churches today, with the number of stations fixed at 14. Of these, only 8 are explicitly mentioned in the gospels. In 1991, Pope John Paul II introduced a new form of this devotion, called the Scriptural Way of the Cross, in which all stations are taken from the gospels.

There are many popular versions of the stations available and people can pray them in a church or at home, privately or with a group. A typical pattern for the 14 stations might look like the following: Naming of the station (E.g. Jesus is condemned to die); Response (We adore you O Christ, and we praise you, because by your Holy Cross you have redeemed the world); Reflecting /meditating on the particular station; and Prayer (E.g. Our Father, Hail Mary and Glory Be)

While available to us as a prayer at any time, Lent is a particularly appropriate time to pray the Stations of the Cross.

- + Find out how you can help a local charity





# Coronavirus COVID-19





The HSE has issued guidelines in relation to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) and issued the following advice to Parishes;

- Suspend the sign of peace with immediate effect.
- Holy water fonts should be emptied and not used.
- Holy Communion should be administered into the <u>hand only</u>, advise Mass goers
  of this before communion is distributed. Everyone administering Holy Communion
  should wash their hands or use alcohol based hand gel before beginning.
- The practice of shaking hands on greeting and departure should be suspended.

The Bishop has asked that in the present circumstances we follow this advice.

#### Our Lady of Perpetual Help

Take my hand, O Blessed Mother Hold me firmly 'lest I fall I grow nervous while I'm walking And on Thee I humbly call.


Guide me over every crossing
