Cosmic Dixie

A man goes on a journey leaving his slaves in charge, each with a job to do. A doorkeeper keeps watch to alert the slaves as to his master's return. The story illustrates the time of waiting between Jesus' first coming as a little baby at Christmas to his second coming on Judgement

Day. But did the slaves really need a doorkeeper to alert them to the master's return? Could it be that the slaves were guilty of only doing their jobs once they thought the master was returning. There's a greater point here of course. Waiting for the second coming shouldn't be a big cosmic game of 'Dixie'. The point is not to wait for the master's return before hurling ourselves into a great whirlwind of things we should have been doing all along. We're not waiting for Jesus' return in the same way we would wait for a bus, we have to spend our waiting time in preparation and constant readiness.

"Keep alert," we are told "keep awake." We are asked to keep alert and awake not for fear of being caught out like naughty school children, but in a spirit of 'keeping our eye on the ball.' We all know how we would like to contribute. Each of us is aware of our unique place on the planet and how we would like to be remembered. Sadly, all too often it is easy for us to 'take our eye off the ball' and get caught up in other concerns.

At the moment the news is full of people who have reached the end of their life unexpectedly. None of us has been afforded an exact time and date for our final preparations. We cannot afford to play 'Cosmic Dixie' Instead we are asked to live in a permanent state of readiness seizing every opportunity on a daily basis to prepare for God's Kingdom. Our Advent goal needs to be about waiting in readiness from this day onwards.

TIME TO THINK!

ADVENT - A TIME TO HOPE


Current restrictions are about to lift. Whilst we continue to live in this time of pandemic, I'm really looking forward to the resumption of public Masses. Whilst we adhere fully to guidelines, it will be lovely to celebrate Mass in public again. While the run up to Christmas will be very different, it's well worth reflecting as Christians, we are invited to pause before we jump straight into Christmas.

This week we begin the liturgical season of advent. A hope filled few weeks, when we prepare to welcome, yet again, the light and peace that is felt at the Lords birth. Jesus is the reason for the season. One of the images that Pope Francis often uses is that of the door. He is calling on us to keep the doors of the Church open. He means that literally: closed doors invite no one in. He is using the image of the door also as a symbol: the Church doors must be open in welcome. The Church must be welcoming especially to those who living in anxiety and hopelessness, to those who are seeking the answers to what life is about. If we dig down a little deeper the Pope is also asking us questions about why so many young people do not find the Church a welcoming Church, while we possess one of the great secrets about the meaning of life which young people are seeking: the message of Jesus Christ and how he reveals that our God is a God of love.

And he takes the image of the Church door one step further. The Church doors must be open so that we go out through them into the world around us to live and witness to the love of God, especially to those who are on the margins of Church life and those who are trapped in the margins of society. There is no point in having our church doors open if we remain happily inside as a closed comfort zone for ourselves and the like minded. There is no point in creating a Church which is locked within itself and within its own history. The Advent message is that the Christian life is always a future-looking one. The Advent wreath is an image of the Church. Week by week we light another candle as our lives move forward step by step in expectation. Our mission as Christians in the world is, as we look forward to Christ's coming, to anticipate that fullness of Christ's teaching through the way we live as individuals and as society, and to ensure that our world does not deviate from God's design for his creation.

How does the message of Advent help us focus better on the fundamental thrust we should be giving to our lives? How does Advent help us to witness in our society to what Christ's coming means? Advent, is a period of waiting, of longing, of anticipation and preparation and of rejoicing that "the Lord is coming", that "the Lord is near"; it encourages us to look to the future as a future of hope and there is no doubt that we need hope today, as individuals, as families, as communities and indeed as a nation. We should learn to think like the Old Testament prophets as they looked forward to the coming of the Saviour. They were sensitive to the experience of injustice and sin under which they lived and looked forward in hope to the coming of "the anointed one", as one whose coming will bring the newness of peace and justice and righteousness.

It was such a hope that enabled the Prophet Isaiah to dream the dream, with those beautiful words: "One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they



train for war again. They shall beat their swords into ploughshares and their spears into pruning hooks".

Advent reminds us that it is possible to change our world, starting out from where we are concretely within all the ambiguities and compromises of life, and move towards the realisation of the ideal of truth, justice and love. The Christian of every generation is called particularly to be awake and attentive to where society is slipping into wrong ways and to cry out like the prophet to return to the ways of God. In our days, sadly, nations still raise weaponry against others. How often do we read about knives being raised in violence and guns in vengeance and lives - young lives, being ruined? I am horrified to see in our world of progress and enlightenment that men and women and children are driven in their hundreds of thousands from the homes through wars as in Syria. Like you, I am greatly worried by the rising tide of xenophobia and racism in our country. Christians in our society must find the ways to speak up and stand up as witnesses to the God of peace and loving care. A God whose very birth took place on the periphery as there was no room for him in the Inn.

Advent then is a moment in which we should interrupt our daily life and think about what is essential. All too often, we live preoccupied by the hecticness of our daily lives, asleep to the wider consequences of our way of life. Following Jesus Christ is a calling to a robust engagement with the challenges of our society. The Christian life is never self-focussed but focussed on self-giving as Jesus gave his life to save us. Christians must learn the ability not just to adapt to the realities of the day but to challenge the realities and the thought-patterns of the day. The Christian must be one who stands out and has the courage to rise above conformity, even when that is not easy.

Advent is not strictly a time of penance and fasting as is Lent. It is marked more rather by a growing sense of joyfulness for the fact that Jesus is coming and that his coming is near. We pray that when he comes he will find us not closed in the comfortable and the familiar, but out there doing God's work and confidently bringing his message of love and hope into the world around us. As we celebrate this season of Advent, may we grow in hopefulness and gratitude. May the light of Christ, brighter than this winter darkness, inspire us to act with kindness and compassion.






Jesus is coming again!

Christmas is coming soon. It is easy to tell. We see the signs all around us. What are the signs? We see Christmas decorations in the stores and on houses, we hear Christmas songs on the radio, we see ads on television and in the newspapers. What if we didn't have all of these things to remind us that Christmas is coming? How would we know? I guess we would just have to look at the calendar.

Two thousand years ago, there was no television or radio. There were no newspaper ads announcing



that a child would be born and that he would be the Saviour of the world. When Jesus was born, very few people even knew about it, but it was an event which God had promised and which had been foretold by prophets many years before. Many people had been looking forward to the coming of the Messiah, they just didn't know exactly when he was coming.

This Sunday marks the beginning of a very special season called Advent. Do you know what Advent means? The dictionary says that advent is "the coming of something very important." What is it? Is it Christmas? Yes, we are looking forward to that, but we are also looking forward to the coming of another very important event. The return of Jesus!

Jesus promised to come again. You won't hear much about it on the television or radio and you won't read much about it in the newspapers, but he promised he would return and we believe it! We look forward to it just as people two thousand years ago looked forward the coming Messiah. We don't know exactly when he will come, it isn't marked on the calendar, but we are watching and waiting.

As we look prepare to celebrate the birthday of our Saviour, let's also be sure we are prepared for the day that he will come again.




Dear Father, we thank you for this special time of year and what it means to us. We thank you for keeping your promise to send a Saviour — and we thank you for the promise that he will come again.

In the name of Jesus we pray. Amen.



The Advent Wreath is a symbol of life and light. The wreath is a circle with neither a beginning nor end, just like God's love

for us. The four candles on the wreath represent the four Sundays in Advent. We light one candle on the Advent wreath every week as we prepare for Christmas. By the fourth Sunday, all four candles are aglow. Three of the candles are purple. **Purple** is the colour of "looking forward". One candle is pink and is lit on the third Sunday in Advent. **Pink** is a happy colour and it reminds us that Christmas is getting nearer. A white candle, known as the Christ Candle, can be placed in the centre of the wreath and lit on Christmas Eve.





The Meaning of Advent

We have all done a lot of waiting in these past months – waiting for different levels of restrictions to pass by, waiting for daily figures from the government, waiting to be able to visit loved ones again, waiting for news of a vaccine or a cure.

The season of **Advent** is also a time of waiting. But, in contrast to much of the waiting we have had to do this year, our advent waiting is characterised by hope and expectation and joy. And this is because we are waiting in confidence for One who has already come to us, who is daily coming to us and who will come to us again – Jesus Christ.

The word 'Advent' stems from the Latin 'Adventus,' meaning 'coming' or 'arrival'. In the Church calendar, the First Sunday of Advent marks the beginning of a new year. Over the Four Sundays of the Advent season we ready ourselves for the joy of Christmas when we remember and commemorate the birth of Christ. But Advent is also about preparing ourselves for His second coming. We are reminded of this second coming in many phrases that we hear or say at Mass, for example 'as we look forward to his second coming', 'when he comes again in glory', 'as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour'. This second coming is a central theme from the beginning of Advent right up to the 17th December. At that point, our attention and preparation shifts more to the commemoration of His first coming on the feast of the Nativity.

Waiting in hope this Advent, we know that Jesus is our light, our salvation, the One for whom we long. How will you ready yourself to welcome Christ into the centre of your life, with all its bits and pieces, once more? As a new Church year begins, will you give yourself the gift of a new relationship with Christ? For through Him hope overcomes despair, peace overcomes division, joy overcomes desolation, love overcomes hatred. *Maranatha! come, Lord Jesus!*

Linking with your Parish Take time alone or as a family to visit your local church to see the Advent wreath and for a moment of quiet prayer.

A Suggestion for the Home

Why not create a prayer space in your home for Advent? You might like to make your own Advent wreath or have a special Advent candle to use in the prayer space, including perhaps purple coloured cloth/ribbons and evergreens. Go to kandle.ie for a video on creating a prayer space.

An Advent Tradition for Church and Home:



THE ADVENT WREATH

The advent wreath has a rich meaning. The circle of the wreath, with no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. The evergreen reminds us of the everlasting life we have in Christ while any pine cones or pods in the wreath represent new life and resurrection. The four candles represent the four Sundays of Advent. Purple is traditionally a colour of penance and prayer while the rose pink candle that is lit on the Third Sunday (Gaudete/Rejoice Sunday) marks our joy as we move ever closer to Christmas.

A Blessing Prayer

Loving God,
let your blessing come upon us
as we light this wreath.
May it be a sign of hope for us
as we prepare for your coming
and may it turn our hearts to you
in the days ahead.
Give us your peace and love
as we wait in joyful hope.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Beginning this Sunday, for the next year on a Sunday we will hear mainly from the Gospel of Mark.

Today, as we step into the season of Advent, the gospel urges us to 'stay awake'. (Chapter 13, Verses 33-37) This passage is a strong reminder to us, as we wait for the coming of the Lord, to live in and pay attention to the present moment. In faith, we trust that Jesus is coming to us all the time. While we wait for his Second Coming we need also to be ready to welcome Him into our lives today. Are we ready to do this? Are we prepared to let Jesus into the 'stuff' of our lives, into all those corners where he can bring His hope, light, peace and love? What would that mean? What might that look like?

An Advent hymn to think about... O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

In many parishes the first sound of Advent is the singing of this traditional hymn. The text for the

verses comes from what are known as the 'O antiphons' that are sung on the last days of Advent. We'll hear more about those in our final Advent Bulletin.

Sometime around the year 1100 an unknown author took these antiphons and turned them into a metrical Latin poem. Eventually, an Anglican priest named John Mason Neale translated the Latin text into English. It was published in an 1853 hymnal by Thomas Helmore, using a 15th century French melody. From these origins we now have one of the most popular and well known Advent hymns.

The verses convey a plaintive mood of longing and yearning for God with each verse giving a name for Jesus that is full of hope. Notice how the petition of the verse is met by the joyful promise of the refrain – 'O Come, O come, Emmanuel...Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel'. In this Advent season we can call on God to come to us, knowing in faith, hope and joy that God answers us. Coronavirus effect on our collections

The Coronavirus pandemic has had a huge effect on how we gather and indeed on our Parish finance and collections. We are very grateful to those who have supported us during this time. Our weekly collections, which as you can see in 2019 averaged over €6,000 each week, have been severely affected. Our income since March is at about 60% of what it has been in recent years. We are grateful to those who have continued to support the parish during this difficult time.

Even when we reopen for public worship we will continue to have restricted congregations and we will not be passing collection baskets or the 'blue bag' for some time to come, maybe we will never return to the traditional collection. We know that we have many very supportive parishioners who continue to donate to the Parish. In response to present circumstances we have introduced a number of new ways in which you can support the Parish along, of course, with the traditional methods - envelope boxes etc. also by using the envelopes and collection boxes in our Churches or by cheque made out to Portlaoise Parish and posted or delivered to the Parish Centre.


