Are you Ready for Christmas?

Wow! There are only sixteen days until Christmas! Are you ready for Christmas? That is a question we hear quite often these days, isn't it? What do people mean when they ask if you are ready for Christmas? Well, they usually mean things like...

- · Do you have all of your shopping done?
- · Have you finished wrapping all your gifts?
- Have you put up your Christmas tree and all the decorations?
- Have you sent your Christmas cards?
- Have you finished baking all of the Christmas goodies?
- · Is your house clean and ready for visitors?

Are you ready for Christmas? What things do you need to do before you will be ready? There is another question that is much more important than "Are you ready for Christmas?" That question is, "Are you ready for Christ?"





In the Gospel today, we hear the voice of John the Baptist crying out to the people, "Prepare the way for the Lord. Fill in the valleys and level off all the mountains. Make the crooked roads straight and the rough places smooth." Did John the Baptist really want the people to work on the roads? No, what John wanted was for the people to get ready for the coming of the Messiah. What he really meant was that the people needed to get their hearts right and return to God. You see, no matter how good people may think they are, there are always some crooked ways and rough places in their lives. There are things such as dishonesty, selfishness, pride, jealousy, and many more.

John wanted the people to make those crooked ways straight and rough places smooth so that Jesus could come and walk among them.

During this special season of the year, you

and I need to make sure that we are ready for the coming of the Christ of Christmas. We need to look into our hearts and ask God to make our crooked ways straight and smooth out the rough places so that we can walk with Jesus each day of our life. Let's ask him to do that right now.

TIME TO THINK!

HOLY WAITING

There are many ways to wait. We know many people Perhaps we can be in touch with the presence of Jesus today who are waiting for the arrival of a better world. There are those who are waiting for the result of a Covid Christmas day. test. Some are waiting for their quarantine period to end. Most are eagerly waiting for a Covid-19 vaccine very soon to be distributed. Others are waiting to see if they will get their job back when the economy recovers. On the other hand, the farmer who sows a winter crop must wait patiently throughout the Spring and Summer for the grain to ripen at harvest time. And a woman expecting the birth of her child waits in a vastly different way to any of these; for her it is a time of great longing, a time of hope. Her time of waiting and hoping is realised in the birth of the child and there is great rejoicing.

Life teaches the farmer or the expectant parent how to wait. The life of faith also teaches us how to wait; to wait in joyful hope for the coming of Christ, for the coming of God, for the fulfilment of life. Advent, from the Latin for 'arrival', is the time the Church remembers and celebrates that our God comes to us: in the Lord Jesus, in the events of our lives, in the silence of our hearts, and beyond this life - when we see the Lord face-to-face.


Jesus, tells the story of a man who leaves his home to go on a journey and puts his slaves in charge while he is away. He assigns them different work including the task of the doorkeeper "to be on the watch". They need to be vigilant because he can return home at any minute. Can we imagine the master's reaction if he finds his doorkeeper not on the job? Sleep, is commonly used to mean inattention, lack of alertness, as well as death. Surely not a good thing this Advent season.

In the prayer 'Patient trust' Pierre Teilhard de Chardin SJ reminds us of the tension between our desire to grasp time as if it is something to purchase and our desire to cooperate with the time of God as if it is a gift. He knows it takes courage to 'let go and let God' because it comes with frustration and uncertainty. Teilhard wants us to trust that it is only God who knows how our life will pan out. To take the risk in following Jesus and to accept our unfinished state.

If the doorkeeper is attentive and patient throughout his shift, he will "keep awake" and be ready to greet his master when he comes. He will be a model of mindfulness, that is awareness that arises from paying attention, on purpose, in the present moment and non-judgmentally.

Can we, like the doorkeeper, accept the frustration and uncertainty of being in waiting? Can we trust that God's hand is leading us, letting our thoughts and feelings come and go in a mindful way?

Above all, trust in the slow work of God.

We are quite naturally impatient in everything to reach the end without delay.

We should like to skip the intermediate stages.

We are impatient of being on the way to something unknown, something new.

And so, I think it is with you;

your ideas mature gradually - let them grow, let them shape themselves, without undue haste.

Don't try to force them on, as though you could be today what time (that is to say, grace and circumstances acting on your own good will)

will make of you tomorrow.

Only God could say what this new spirit gradually forming within you will be.



A Central Figure of Advent: John the Baptist

Over the weeks of Advent we encounter a number of key characters in the unfolding story of our salvation. In the Gospel this Sunday we are introduced to John the Baptist. An older cousin of Jesus, he was a prophet sent by God to prepare people for the coming of Jesus Christ into the world. His life was one of continually pointing to Jesus. When his mother, Elizabeth, was pregnant with John, she was visited by Mary, and John leapt in her womb. This revealed to Elizabeth that the child Mary carried was the Son of God.

John's desert ministry was all about calling people to be ready for Jesus and the change he would bring to their lives. John's call to repentance is not mere fire and brimstone, scare tactics, but is a call rooted in the belief that God is coming to His people and we need to be ready. John's message provokes us into action, calling us to turn back to God and to ready ourselves for Christ to come into our lives. Crucially, this personal readying involves looking beyond ourselves, to how we treat others and live with others. As followers of Jesus, it calls us to lives of justice and right relationship with one another; it calls us to acts of kindness and charity to neighbour and stranger.

For the desert places in which we walk,
the streets we roam, the paths we cross,
guide our feet, take us to places where You would go.
Give us words that You would use
that in this Advent season of promise and preparation
we might point the way with John the Baptist
to the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!

An Advent Tradition

While the Christmas tree is very much part of the Christmas season, over the course of Advent the tree will begin to appear in more and more homes, signalling that we are getting closer to the feast of Christmas.

In the midst of winter, the evergreen tree, dressed with lights, reminds us of the life and light that comes to us through Christ. The colourful decorations of the tree are a reminder of the paradise tree of the garden of Eden, hung with the bright colour of fruit.

Families are invited to say the following prayer together when they put up the Christmas tree in their home

An Advent hymn to think about.... O Comfort My People

People will recognise the traditional Irish setting of this Advent hymn as *Bi iosa im chroise (Jesus, be in my heart)*. The words are based on the bible text of Isaiah 40 and were adapted and put to music by the late Chrysogonous Waddell, an American Trappist monk, liturgist and musician.

The soothing melody carries a strong proclamation of hope as we continue our Advent journey. In Isaiah 40, the prophet is looking ahead to a time of great pain when the People of God will experience exile from their homeland. His message from God to the people answers the questions they will have in the midst of their shock and suffering – Does God want to deliver us? Can God deliver us? Will God do it? God's response is yes; I have not forsaken you, I have not abandoned you, I am with you.

Wherever we are today, Isaiah's message from God still holds true. God speaks to us with words of comfort. In the root of the word, comfort is not just about being soothed. It is about being strengthened, being encouraged. Today, this Advent, God is coming to us to bring us comfort, to bring us strength and encouragement, to speak to our hearts with the good news of His love. Is your heart open for God?

- 1. O Comfort my people and calm all their fear, and tell them the time of salvation is near. O tell them I come to remove all their shame. Then they will for ever give praise to my name.

Weekly Advent Gospel Link

Prepare the way of the Lord make straight his paths.

On the second Sunday of Advent we hear again from Mark's Gospel. We are now in Year B of the three year cycle of Sunday readings named Year A, B and C. Today, the text we hear comes from the start of Mark's writing and he opens with a very direct message. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is the Good News, the gospel. Mark's whole Gospel is about revealing for us who Jesus is.

Every day we listen out for the news of the day. But the Gospel of Jesus is the news of our salvation. And the message of John the Baptist points firmly to Jesus as the source of our salvation. The challenging figure of John the Baptist continues to call us, even today, to examine ourselves as we prepare to welcome Jesus into our lives once more. John reminds us that we are a baptised, forgiven people. We can be grateful for this forgiveness but we can also choose to be a better person as a result of it. And we can choose to share forgiveness with others in our lives. A key part of our Advent preparation is about figuring out this question: what would it mean for me to be a better person, to be a forgiven and forgiving person, straightening the path for Jesus to take root in my life?
