

Wanted: Something More Important



"Wanted:- Men and women willing to leave behind their old way of life and become fishers men."

There aren't many of us who would jump at this job application. It isn't that we don't want to

become fishers of men, its leaving behind our old way of life that we're not too keen on. It seems that there is very little that would persuade us to abandon our own self-interest.

In today's gospel one of the most impressive elements is that the early disciples accept the call to repent, abandon their fishing nets and follow Jesus. That they turn away from a successful business in order to become 'fishers of men' is a measure of their commitment.

Today there are still those who accept the challenge to abandon everything and become fishers of men. Each year, thousands of men and women give their lives to God and join religious orders. How do the rest of us answer to call to become 'fishers of men'? We can't all join religious orders; we have to find a way of answering the call in our own situation, and we might have lots of questions to ask first. What would being a disciple involve? Would we be up to the job? What would we have to give up? Would part time discipleship be okay ... after all we've got lots else to do!

There would be lots of questions we would ask, but sadly no easy answers. There is no one answer that is right for everybody. But the one important message for us today is that discipleship usually means a major shift in direction; a change that involves leaving behind things that get in the way of our relationship with God. It is left to each of us to decide what our particular mode of discipleship might be, and what stands in the path of our new direction. Our new direction has to start with some good hard soul searching, and a real desire to do something more important with our lives.

TIME TO THINK!

It's NEARLY SPRING. . .. A TIME OF HOPE

As the evenings lengthen and new signs of life appear in our gardens, we welcome a new Spring. The following ancient story tells how the simple Spring air can refresh and indeed heal;

"The King needs daintier food," said the Court Cook, so he served broiled peacock on toast, and pomegranates and cream, and wild honey, and cheese-cakes as light as feathers, and a sponge cake made with the eggs of a bantam hen. But the King would eat none of them.

"The King needs medicine," said the Court Physician, so he searched the countryside for growing things and he brewed rose-leaf tea, and he made a potion of everlasting flowers mixed with rosemary, and he distilled wild honeysuckle with dew gathered at sunrise, but the King would drink none of these.

"Perhaps music would divert the King," suggested the Court Wise Man. "It might make him forget whatever is troubling him." Immediately the palace was filled with music, some of it very beautiful and all of it played by very famous people. But at the end the King was still weak and sorrowful. A harpist from a far country came and played music that sounded like the mighty wind on high mountain tops and the rushing flow of great mountain streams. But the King only thanked the harpist and requested that he be paid for his pains and his journey and go back to his home. Later, there came a trumpeter who gave great battle calls on his trumpet, but the King covered his ears to shut out the sound and looked more sad than ever because the sound of the trumpet gave him a headache. So it seemed as if not even music would make the King well, and no one knew what to do.

Gladheart was the little boy who tended sheep in the valley. He was the youngest of five brothers, and there was little room and less food for them in their father's house. But Gladheart had been given his name because he always smiled over a crust of bread, even when he was a baby. Now that he was a little lad of ten with a great flock of ewes and lambs to tend and drive through sun and storm, he had smiles and kind words for all, and he played his fiddle all day long until its sweet tunes filled the valley. I know that soon the meadows will be full of growing grass and the forested hills will be awash in bright, green leaves. I know that soon our gardens and pathways will once again be alive with the glory of God's creation. I know that soon we will be unlocked, freed from pandemic and in time much brighter days ahead to once again embrace and so appreciate the things we once took for granted.

We too are a part of that creation, but unlike the flowers in the field we have the ability to bloom even when the world around us is cold, dark, and harsh. We have the ability to share our beauty in the face of ugliness, our joy in the face of fear, and our love in the face of hate. We have the ability to make every day feel like the first day of Spring.

May you bloom well then today and always. May you shine your light. May you share your love. May you be truly alive in the glory of God's creation. And may you forever make your Heavenly Father smile.

Answering the Call

They didn't say, "Not right now, we're busy mending our nets. Perhaps some other time." No, the Gospel says that they left their father sitting in the boat with the hired hands and followed Jesus.

Jesus is still calling for help today. He has called you and me to help him to bring others into God's Kingdom. Is it an emergency? It sure is! It's a matter of life and death! The Bible says, "Unless you repent, you will all perish." (Luke 13:3) Jesus has called us, what will we say? What will we do? I hope and pray that we will drop whatever we are doing and answer the call.

Dear Jesus,



GALILEE NEWS JESUS FISH FOLLOW SEA BOAT NET

Bonnie Mando was frustrated when COVID-19 forced the shutdown of in-person worship at St. Francis of Assisi Roman Catholic Church in Binghamton back in March. She had to get used to a new language with words like "YouTube," "livestream" and "subscribe."

Her search for faith brought her first to the parish's Sunday Mass on YouTube.

"Unlike some of the other liturgies that I was encouraged to 'attend' by friends, access to the weekly Mass at St. Francis was simple," she said. "I didn't have to tune in at any specific time — that was a big plus for me."

Mando checked out other parish Masses but noticed new technology left some struggling with poor audio or video. She was "saddened" by coverage of overcrowded hospitals and many deaths in Italy due to the virus. That's when Mando learned Pope Francis' daily Mass was being live-streamed. She connected through ShalomWorld.org.

"I was really drawn in by Francis' particularly relevant intention of the day," she said. "I honestly was also attracted by the technology that made it seem as if he were really close to me, not at a distance and in a place that was not distracting."

The Pope's Mass was over early one morning, and shortly after, another started on the website.

"The celebrant seemed to be speaking with a slight accent; I was interested when I discovered that I was actually in Ireland — Portlaoise, to be exact. A guitarist sang a wonderful opening hymn that I didn't recognize, and there were at least three or four other priests concelebrating," she said.

Mando's ethnic background is Irish "through and through," though she hadn't ever taken a lot of interest in the country.

"I never have been to Ireland, never had a pen pal — something very common when I was growing up," she said.

"But when I heard the priests and the musicians at this parish in Ireland, Saints Peter and Paul, located in the midlands of Ireland," Mando said, "I was immediately drawn in."

Though the church is more than 3,000 miles from her home in Chenango Bridge, Mando speaks of the priests there like she met them in person. There's the pastor, Msgr. John Byrne, who often compliments the TV crew. Father David Vard, ordained just three years ago. Father Ciprian Matei is a missionary from Romania.

Mando has also taken a virtual tour of the church. She's enjoyed liturgical music that she calls "familiar and different."

"Once you've 'attended,' you get daily notifications of the services. It has been easy to share with others, including technically challenged seniors like myself," Mando said. "The parish has its own webcam and parish radio, and a very informative webpage.

"I feel I'm involved in parish partnership around the world. You just have to listen to the prayer requests at my Irish parish," she said. "Canada, Australia, Pennsylvania, Malaysia, India, Sri Lanka."

Mando discovered that others in Broome County are "attending" the church, too. That's after she asked for an intention for a friend who had died. "A woman from Endwell, someone I do not know, called the man's widow to say that she had heard Bob's name mentioned during the Irish Mass," she said. There are other local connections as well. After corresponding with one of the priests in Ireland, Mando found he'd served in Kenya and knew a nun now in Endicott.

"I called Sister Anisia Muthoni, a friend stationed at St. Anthony of Padua," she said. "I told her that I had 'met' Father Eddie. Amazingly, she told me that she knew him well."

Mando says participating with people of faith all over the world has helped her "hear the word of God more clearly." While being interconnected has excited her, she'll be "thrilled to rejoin" her local parish at worship services again.

But she "may always continue to join others virtually for the new eyes and ears and heart which this has given me." "I've always said I was a universal Catholic by virtue of my physically moving to many places and being privileged to have found wonderful extended families there," Mando said.

Ireland is operating a containment strategy in line with WHO and ECDC advice



Statement from Laois GPs 20/1/21

We are heartened to see the day-on-day reduction in case numbers and expect hospital admission to reduce shortly. We would like to thank everyone in our community for their efforts which has most certainly contributed to this reduction.

However, it is important that we all continue in our efforts to supress this virus so that we may see a return to normal life in the not-too-distant future. It is vital that we continue to keep our contacts to a minimum and stay at home except for non-essential purposes. The arrival of several vaccines has added to our armoury in the fight against COVID-19.

Laois GPs are looking forward to assisting in the roll out of the vaccination programme in our community in the coming weeks.

The 1st roll out of the vaccination programme will involve GPs and their teams vaccinating those patients that are over 70. It is expected that we shall commence with those over 85 in the first instance and then over 80 and so on. Each practice will have different arrangements in place to roll this out and will advise their patients accordingly.

We are receiving a large volume of calls in relation to vaccine queries. Each practice will adhere to the recommended roll out as advised by the HSE and the National Immunisation Committee. The large volume of vaccine related queries via phone and e-mail to surgeries is placing additional strain on the administration system of GP practices locally. We ask that you avoid contacting your GP surgery to be put on a list as there are no lists. If you have concerns or are seeking advice in relation to the vaccine, please find below a list of recommended sites where you may find the answer to your query.
