





Back From the Brink

'Dysfunctional' is a word we hear a lot nowadays. Parents who drink, gamble or who neglect their children are deemed 'dysfunctional'. Those who

take drugs, steal or spend aimless and less than useful lives are labelled dysfunctional. As a society we are often guilty of shunning the dysfunctional, fearing them or even despising them. For those of us who have been labelled as dysfunctional we sink into an abyss of loneliness and desperation. There are those of us who know what it is like to have sunk so low that there seems no way back.

The leper in today's story knew no way back from the affliction that had ostracised him from society ... no way back that is, until he heard of Jesus. The leper kneels before Jesus and begs for a cure, and moved by pity Jesus makes him well again, commanding him not to rush off and tell everyone. Of course, the leper cannot keep Jesus a secret. The ex leper has not just been healed of an illness, he has been rescued from an existence where he could not function at any level. Now the ex leper can return to his home, his community and his loved ones. For the ex leper his life has been transformed. His life had been restored, but restored with a meaning it didn't have before. The ex leper has been made whole, emotionally, spiritually and physically. How can he keep his tremendous joy to himself?

Today we are asked to put ourselves in the place of the leper. Jesus asks us to look at our lives and ask ourselves what is missing. What is it that can isolate us? What is it that builds barriers? What makes us live lives of bigotry, fear, anger, jealousy, frustration, insecurity, pain or misunderstanding? What is missing from our lives that could make us function as a whole? Might it be purpose, determination, humility, courage, forgiveness, mission God?

When God brings us back from the brink of isolation, it is hard to feel anything but joy, and if that joy is contagious, is there any better way to promote Jesus' desire for living life in wholeness?





Our KandLe Family Lenten Promises Let's do Lent together in 2021

What is this?

Bishop Denis is inviting families ahead of the Lenten season, (beginning on Ash Wednesday, February 17), to sit down together and share ideas on

how you might together and /or individually take on acts of prayer, fasting and charity of your choosing before completing the 'Our KandLe Family Lenten Promises' sheet. If you live alone, remember you are part of your parish and the KandLe diocesan family – join your Lenten promises to those of the rest of your faith family.

Why acts of prayer, fasting and charity in Lent?

The season of Lent gives us a chance to think about our life as followers of Jesus and to prepare ourselves to be ready to renew our baptism at Easter. It can be a time of reflection and taking stock, a time of turning back to




God and reminding ourselves of what it means to live as a follower of Jesus, as a Christian in the world. The Lenten good works of prayer, fasting and charity are there to help give us this focus.

Prayer The COVID-19 pandemic has seen so many people turning to God in prayer - a reminder to us of what we instinctively know to be true - that God loves us and cares for us, and is with us always. This Lent could be a great time for families to begin or renew praying together. We can be aware of God and talk to God in prayer in so many ways. Saying a prayer before your main meal together, blessing yourselves when you leave your home, praying a



decade of the rosary, reading and thinking about a passage from the bible, joining in a time of prayer in your local church via technology, saying a night time prayer, visiting your parish church for a short time of prayer? What appeals to you in these suggestions? What other suggestions do family members have?

Fasting Many people see Lent as a time of fasting from something. We might give up sweets or cigarettes or alcohol, or meat on a Friday; we might fast from words that are hurtful to



ourselves and others or we might fast from habits that keep us from living well. We can always take it one step further and take up a positive action! We might, for example, decide on concrete actions that will help the environment such as conserving water, recycling properly and turning off lights. The fasting we do can help us create a space in our lives for God, who feeds all our hungers. Are there habits that we have that are causing pain or hurt in our families that we could try to give up this Lent? What suggestions do family members have for fasting?

Charity Linked to our fasting, whatever form it may take, is a concern for those who have no choice but to fast because of poverty and injustice. That concern connects us directly back to our baptismal commitment of making Christ present in our world through our actions. There is a great tradition in Ireland of supporting Trócaire in Lent and learning more about its work. How



might your family support Trócaire this Lent? Do you have suggestions for other ways of giving money or assistance/acts of kindness to those in need locally, especially needs arising from COVID-19 this Lent?

TIME TO THINK!

LENT - A TIME FOR TRUE PRAYER

Lent in lockdown is perhaps enough penance for any of us!! Living through a pandemic brings huge challenges, not just physically but also emotionally and indeed spiritually. Many find comfort and hope by nourishing our spiritual lives. Lent is an opportune time.

"But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you". Matthew 6:6

One of the most important parts of true prayer is that it takes place deep in the inner room of your soul. It is there in the inner depths of your being that you will meet God. Saint Teresa of Ávila, one of the greatest spiritual writers in the history of our Church, describes the soul as a castle in which God dwells. Meeting Him, praying to Him and communing with Him requires that we enter into the deepest and innermost chamber within this castle of our soul. It We come to know Him more fully and, little by little, is there, in the innermost dwelling, that the full glory and beauty of God is discovered.

God is not just a God who is "out there" far away in Heaven. He is a God who is closer and more intimate than we could ever imagine. Lent is a time, more than any other time of the year, when we must strive to make that journey inward so as to discover the Indwelling of the Most Holy Trinity.

What does God want of you this Lent? It's easy to begin Lent with more superficial commitments, such as giving up a favourite food or doing an extra good deed. Some choose to use Lent as a time to get in better physical shape, and others decide to dedicate more time to spiritual reading or other holy exercises. All of this is good and useful. But you can be certain that the deepest desire of our Lord for you this Lent is that you pray.

Prayer, of course, is much more than saying prayers. It's not only saying the rosary, or meditating upon Scripture, or reciting beautifully composed prayers. Prayer is ultimately a relationship with God. It's an encounter with the Triune God who dwells within you. True prayer is an act of love between you and your beloved. It's an exchange of persons: your life for God's. Prayer is an act of union and communion by which we become one with God and God becomes one with us.

The great mystics have taught us that there are I will turn many levels to prayer. We often begin with the recitation of prayers, such as the beautiful prayer of the rosary. From there we meditate, ponder and reflect deeply upon the mysteries of our Lord and His life.



discover that we are no longer just thinking about God, but we are gazing at Him face to face.

As we begin the holy season of Lent, reflect upon your practice of prayer. If the images of prayer presented here intrigue you, then make a commitment to discover more. Commit yourself to the discovery of God in prayer. There is no limit and no end to the depth to which God wants to draw you through prayer. True prayer is never boring. When you discover true prayer, you discover the infinite mystery of God. And this discovery is more glorious than anything you could ever imagine in life.

Some put his age at the time of death to be as old as ninety but more likely he had reached late seventies or early eighties. Despite the passage of over fourteen hundred years since his death, St. Fintan's legacy continues to live on and there are many strong associations with his name in this part of Co. Laois; St. Fintan's Hospital in Portlaoise; St. Fintan's Churches in Mountrath, Raheen and Ballyfin; Scoil Fionntáin Naofa in Shanahoe; and St. Fintan's GAA Club in Mountrath – to name but a few.

The place of St. Fintan's birth is uncertain but it is generally considered that Clonkeen in the parish of Raheen was his birthplace. He descended from the very same stock as St. Brigid (who died in the year 523 – eighty years before Fintan's death). As a young man he entered Terryglass Monastery on the banks of Lough Derg in Co. Tipperary which was run at that time by St. Columba. After passing his noviciate, Fintan and two companions moved to Clonenagh and founded a monastery there. He collected around him a community of monks who lived under very strict rule. They tilled the land by spade or hoe and they abstained from all animal food. They had not even a single cow as their strict rule did not even allow them the use of butter or milk.

In prayer, fasting and in constant vigils, St. Fintan passed his years never relaxing the rules of his strict observances. It is believed that he performed many miracles during his lifetime. For example, on one occasion a man whose son was paralysed prostrated himself at Fintan's feet and asked in God's name that his son might be healed. Fintan extended his hands in prayer and soon afterwards the paralysed man recovered to full health.

It is widely believed that a famous school existed at St. Fintan's monastery in Clonenagh and that a seminary flourished there long after his death producing scholars of the most profound learning. It is also believed that the "Book of Cluain Eidhneach" was written by St. Fintan and other writers. Many distinguished disciples flocked to what was regarded as a hive of wisdom at Clonenagh while St. Fintan was abbot there. Amongst them was the celebrated St. Comgall, founder of Bangor Abbey in Co. Down who is also associated with the founding of a church at Shanakill near Shanahoe.

The Clonenagh monastic site has traditionally attracted passers-by on what was formerly the Dublin to Limerick road because of the fame of what became known as the 'Money Tree.' Tradition has it that this sycamore tree hosted the well of St. Fintan and pilgrims left coins in its trunk and branches – thus it became known locally as the 'Money Tree.' The original sycamore tree fell to the ground during a storm some years ago but a healthy new tree has since taken root in the same spot.

What of St. Fintan's association with Cromogue in the parish of Raheen? According to local tradition St. Fintan first lived at Cromogue before taking up residence at Clonenagh. It is said that when his monks had brought the building materials to both sites, the churches of Clonenagh and Cromogue were built in the course of one night. St. Fintan's Road, which was an old causeway from Clonenagh to Cromogue, is said to have been of miraculous origin, its construction believed to have been instantaneous. The ruins of an old church still stand at Cromogue cemetery and there is a belief that until its tower falls to the ground St. Fintan will celebrate Midnight Mass there every Christmas Eve. A short walking distance from these ruins in a tranquil and scenic spot is St. Fintan's Well, a peaceful place which attracts numerous visitors all year round. Many pilgrims take a small stone from the bottom of the well and keep it as a preservative against accidental death. Another local tradition concerns the one-eyed trout which, if spotted in the well, will relieve the fortunate pilgrim of any ailment they may be suffering.

When St. Fintan found that his death was approaching, he called his brethren around him. He named Fintan Maeldubh as his successor as abbot of Clonenagh. Then raising his hand and imparting benediction on his people, and having received Holy Communion, he passed to his eternal reward. It was the 17th day of February, thus the celebration of the feast day of St. Fintan on that date.



Also known as Pancake Tuesday - 16th February 2021


Why do we eat pancakes on Shrove Tuesday - Pancake Day?

It was the last chance for a spot of indulgence before 40 days of fasting, and also an opportunity to use up food that couldn't be eaten during Lent. This included eggs, fat and milk, which were made into pancakes and eaten on that day. The earliest known English recipe dates from the 15th century, although pancakes had been eaten in other countries for centuries before that.

7 tips to make the perfect pancake every time!

- 1. Check the freshness of your flour
- Whisk your dry ingredients to avoid big lumps
- Resist the over-mix
- 4. Rest the batter overnight
- 5. Use a big skillet or, better yet, a griddle
- 6. Wipe out the pan between batches
- 7. Pay attention so they do not burn

Ingredients





- 300ml semi-skimmed milk
- 1 tbsp sunflower/vegetable
 oil plus extra for frying
- pinch salt

Method;

- 1. Put 100g plain flour and a pinch of salt into a large mixing bowl.
- Make a well in the centre and crack 2 eggs into the middle.
- 3. Pour in about 50ml from the 300ml of semi-skimmed milk and 1 tbsp. sunflower oil, then start whisking from the centre, gradually drawing the flour into the eggs, milk and oil. Once all the flour is incorporated, beat until you have a smooth, thick paste. Add a little more milk if it is too stiff to beat.
- 4. Add a good splash of milk and whisk to loosen the thick batter. While still whisking, pour in a steady stream of the remaining milk. Continue pouring and whisking until you have a batter that is the consistency of slightly thick single cream.
- 5. Heat the pan over a moderate heat, then wipe it with oiled kitchen paper.
- Ladle some batter into the pan, tilting the pan to move the mixture around for a thin
 and even layer. Quickly pour any excess batter into the mixing bowl, return the pan
 to the heat.
- Leave to cook, undisturbed, for about 30 secs. If the pan is the right temperature, the pancake should turn golden underneath after about 30 secs and will be ready to turn.
- Hold the pan handle, ease a palette knife under the pancake, then quickly lift and flip it over. Make sure the pancake is lying flat against the base of the pan with no folds, then cook for another 30 secs before turning out onto a warm plate.
- Continue with the rest of the batter, serving them as you cook or you can freeze the pancakes for 1 month, wrapped in cling film or make them up to a day ahead. Enjoy!




