

Hitting **Hypocrisy** Where It Hurts

Imagine the scene. Jesus whip makes and drives the money changers

from the temple. Everywhere sheep and cattle are careering out of control. Doves are flapping up to the rafters.... coins and feathers everywhere and the money changers in an uproar. Jesus makes things clear. "Stop making my Father's house a market place!"

De we feel an element of discomfort. How many parishes use the back of church to raise funds? How often do we stand at the back of church selling raffle tickets? How many years have we invited donations for votive candles, or sold newspapers, books, rosary beads, cards and statues? If Jesus walked in today, would he tip over our collecting boxes and reprimand us?

Perhaps before we answer this question we need to understand the context of today's reading. In Jesus' day it was expected that visitors to the temple should present a sacrifice, and for that purpose, the temple officials made it easy to purchase cattle and turtle doves. The second practical consideration was that because the Roman coinage was considered idolatrous by the Jews, the temple permitted money changers to exchange roman coins for tokens. The original system was not a bad idea, but it became corrupt. It was all too easy for the price of doves to become extortionate, and the exchange rate for tokens to come down on the side of the money changers. Soon it was the case that something that had originally been intended to oil the practicalities of worship in itself cheated would-be worshippers, especially those with little money. Jesus had a passion for exposing hypocrisy, and this was hypocrisy at its worst.

Jesus probably would not have a problem with us using the back of church for selling newspapers or raising funds. At the end of the day it isn't buildings of worship in themselves that are of the greater importance, but what lies in our hearts and in our intentions. Our bodies are the real temples. Jesus challenged impurity at its roots, and the root of all impurity is wherever we have a thought or an idea that lacks integrity or smacks of hypocrisy.








Cleaning House

Spring is such a wonderful time of the year. The temperature begins to warm and the world begins to take on a fresh new look. The trees start to put on leaves, the grass begins to turn green, and the flowers start to bloom. Everything is beautiful! There are other things that tell us that spring is here too. This morning I want to tell you about a time when Jesus did some spring cleaning. It was time for the annual Passover celebration, so Jesus travelled to Jerusalem. When he arrived in Jerusalem, Jesus went to the temple. He couldn't believe his eyes. There in the temple area he saw people who were selling cattle, sheep, and doves for the people to use as sacrifices in the temple. There were tables set up for money changers so that people could change their money to pay their temple taxes. It looked more like a carnival than a house of worship.

Jesus did not like what he saw. He was so angry that he made a whip from some rope and he drove the cattle and sheep and those who were selling them from the temple. He went to the tables of the money changers and turned them over, scattering coins all over the temple floor. To the ones who were selling the doves he said, "Get these out of here! How dare you turn my Father's house into a market." Yes, I would say that Jesus did some spring cleaning in the temple that day!

As we think about Jesus cleansing the temple, we should also think about some other cleaning

that needs to be done. We are in a season called Lent. At first, the word Lent meant 'the season of spring'. But it has now become much more than that. It is a time to look inside ourselves and see if there is anything in us that needs to be changed. Are there some areas of your life where Jesus needs to do some 'spring cleaning'? I know there are in mine!

My Prayer

TIME TO THINK!

WE NEED EACH OTHER

Carole King's fabulous song *Tapestry* begins with these words: My life has been a tapestry of rich and royal hue, an everlasting vision of the ever-changing view, a wondrous woven magic in bits of blue and gold, a tapestry to feel and see, impossible to hold.'

Those few words speak of the tapestry of our lives in a simple yet direct manner. There are high points and deep troughs, colourful days and drab occasions, tears and laughter – all come together to shape who we are, painting the picture of our brief lives

How might we determine the consequence of our last twelve months of lockdown crisis, with all the pain brought about by viral infection?

If we have learnt anything it could be summed up in one word - interdependence. Day after day we have been faced with our dependence on others, medics in our health service caring for the sick, essential workers in our supermarkets, home delivery drivers bringing goods to our front door, teachers supporting home tuition and many more. Even in lockdown we are not self-sufficient, we need the help and support of others as we live through a radically changing pattern of life.

After supper one night, Thay held an empty rice bowl and said,

Think of all the threads that are passing through this bowl.

Think of the people who made it.

Think of those who taught them their craft.

Think of the fire that making this dish required.

Think of the wood cutters.

This is a story developed round the simple rice bowl, a common enough pot in Vietnamese culture, handled day after day without a second thought. Yet each line explores the back story that made this simple bowl available for everyday use. Those directly responsible for forming the shaped clay that gives substance to the bowl, the skill of the potter, the craft of an artist acquired over many years. But he didn't work alone. Others dug the clay from the earth, gathered the wood for the fire that baked the simple small shape in the kiln, giving it permanence in order that it might fulfil its intended use.

Yet, when finished it remained empty until the culinary skills of the kitchen cooks prepared food to fill it for others to eat. The raw ingredients, gathered from the skill of farmers, transformed by their experienced hands in to a meal to feed strangers.

that all life on earth depends on. It tells of the evaporated moisture from the oceans falling as rain to earth for our nourishment and use. Truly as he concludes 'The whole universe is present in this bowl'. In a few words he shows us simply and without fuss how we depend on each other in our daily lives.

Maybe that is the greatest lesson from the pandemic that has swept our world causing so much havoc and confusion. Our response has been to realise how much we depend on others in our time of need.

A SPORTING ANECDOTE FROM SHANAHOE

I am struck by how significant the quote by Chicago Bear's player Singletary is this year, looking back on 2020. "Do you know what my favourite part of the game is? The opportunity to play." Back in March 2020, Shanahoe Ladies Gaelic football club struggled to visualise how the girls and women of our club would even train let alone play county championship. Who would have anticipated in March, the year that would unfold for our humble club, a testament to the commitment, dedication and hard work of all involved.

The curtain went up on the grand finale the week of September 23rd with the Laois ladies Intermediate football championship final. Having come through as underdogs against Ballyroan in the semi-final on the 16th of September our intermediates lined out against Park Ratheniska in the final. Reduced spectator numbers due to Covid restrictions, did not dampen the atmosphere. A tightly contested game from the start, Shanahoe were down 3 points in the closing stages of the second half. Clawing back to 1-8 apiece in the dying moments Shanahoe dug deep, worked from the back, with determination and passion resulting in the winning point in injury time. A truly thrilling result for a "tight knit group who look out for one another on and off the field."

This statement is borne out by all the research conducted into the effects of girls and women's involvement in sport. "Women football players build life-long friendships". In 2017 the L.G.F.A. with Lidl conducted the first Irish national study on girls in sport. The results indicate that girls who play sport demonstrate greater mental well-being, greater ability to cope with pressures of life, feel more inspired, less overwhelmed and less depressed. In one word sport builds resilience!


Never have we heard that word used more than during these Covid times and arguably we never needed it more!

Getting back to that memorable week of September 23rd. Having the Intermediate county title in the bag the focus moved to our under 14 squad. Week after week they turned up to the pitch full of the joys, undaunted by Covid, chatting and slagging. They worked hard and the good news came there would be a county championship to play. Between lockdowns we progressed from round to round and arrived at a semi-final on the 18th of September, playing Portlaoise in their home ground Rathleague. It was a gruelling match trading point for point but the girls through sheer grit held on and finished 2 points ahead.

So 4 days after the Intermediate final the red and black lined out again in a second county final in Annanough pitch playing St. Josephs. Our girls quietly went about their business working hard for each other; it ended all square at the full time whistle. Extra time, half time saw Shanahoe behind by 3 points so all to do in the final 10 minutes. The momentum turned and following a well worked goal Shanahoe with huge heart, grit and determination pushed on to win by 9 points. Tears of joy flowed freely it had been a real team effort from 1 to 19 another corner stone cementing the bonds of loyal friendship. Olympic gymnasts Mary Lou Ritton put it well when she said "A trophy carries dust. Memories last forever".






