
St. Brigio Tuesday 1st February Patroness of our Diocese




St. Brigid is renowned for her hospitality, almsgiving and care for the sick. She was born c.454. When she was young her father wished to make a very suitable marriage for her but she insisted in consecrating her life to God. She received the veil

and spiritual formation probably from St. Mel and stayed for a period under his direction in Ardagh. Others followed her example and this led her to found a double monastery in Kildare with the assistance of Bishop Conleth. She died in 524. The St. Brigid's Cross was used by Brigid to explain the Christian faith. Along with Saints Conleth and Lazarian, Brigid is Paton of our Diocese of Kildare and Leighlin.





Only a Carpenter's Son

I am going to tell you some things about my young friend, his name is John, things about him and you tell me whether you believe.

John likes the colour red, Do you think that could be true? We may not know what his favourite colour is, but it is certainly possible that he likes the colour red.

John likes ice cream. Do you think that could be true?

Sure, what kid doesn't like ice cream?

John likes to play sports. Could that be true? Sure it could. Many boys and girls like to play sports so it is quite possible that John does too.

Here is something you probably didn't know. John has the power to heal the sick of all their diseases. Do you think that could be true? You don't? Why not? Well, you know John and he is just an ordinary kid like you. He lives right here in the same town, you go to the same school, and play on the same soccer team. There is no way he has the power to heal sick, is there?

In the day that Jesus lived, many people had a hard time believing some of the things that they heard about him. This was especially true of the people in his home town of Nazareth. People had heard about the miracles that Jesus had done in Capernaum and they just didn't know how they could be true. After all, wasn't he Joseph's son? How could the son of a carpenter do all of the things that they had heard about?

Jesus said to them, "Surely you will quote this proverb to me: 'Physician, heal yourself! Do here in your hometown what we have heard that you did in Capernaum.' I tell you the truth," he continued, "no prophet is accepted in his hometown.

The people in the synagogue became furious. They got up, drove him out of the town, and took him up on the hill on which the town was built, because they wanted to throw him off of a cliff. But he walked right through the crowd and went on his way.

What a way to treat a hometown boy! It seems that no matter what Jesus did, he just couldn't seem to please the people in his own hometown. I wonder, if you and I had lived in Nazareth during Jesus' day, would we have treated him any better, or would we have gone along with the crowd?



The spring in our story is about being able to begin again. Spring-time embraces the possible.

This is a time when for many people real questions are being asked regarding, where as a nation do we go from here. I suggest that part of this discernment is about tapping into the spring of giftedness, talent and abundance, found within the depths of all our being. Surely the wonderful neighbours and good people that are the living fabric of every community, reminds us that people are more important than policy and community is far more powerful that an economy.

The spring marks a significant change in the year. I am grateful for the powerful gift of hope, given to me recently by many good people who have gone from this life marked with the sign of faith.

pastures,


to a foothill of magic in the County of Clare, where a spring of cold water runs through a cold cave, and the water is wishes from the wells of our hearts,

Gabrielle Jin will make her First Profession at 10am Mass on Tuesday 1st February – The Feast of St. Brigid.

Hello, my name is Gabrielle Jin. I am from a city along the Southeast coast of China, and have been living in Ireland for ten years now. I grew up in a traditional Catholic family. In my grandparents' generation, faith was something they would die for and was the greatest legacy to pass on to us. Their witness of faith never stops to influence my vocation to this day.

My vocation journey in Ireland started with a general conversation with a friend. She shared a thought on abortion saying "a woman's body is no longer her own when she conceives, but is shared with her baby." That line just didn't go away from my mind and I went to pray on it. I felt so overwhelmed by it as if the Lord is



saying to me, "Gabrielle, you receive me in the Blessed Sacrament everyday, but do you really let me share your heart and your body?" The effect of that prayer was beyond words. It awakened in me the desire to be a Christ bearer.

I've been with the Presentation Congregation for three years now, and currently a Novice with the Presentation Sisters in Ashbrook Gardens on the Mountrath road. I feel quite at home among the sisters, maybe in part I see in our elder sisters the spirit of joy and love I was so acquainted with in the life of my grandma. I know I owe my vocation to her prayers in Heaven too.

Today, we live in a time where religious communities are aging and vocations are few. I've been asked by many, "what is it like for you to join a congregation where the majority of the Sisters are retired and in a culture so different from your own?" Well, it's like everyone else might have experienced when making a big transition in life. There are moments of loneliness, doubts and despondency, and of course feelings of homesickness at times! Those moments could be hard but meanwhile are great opportunities to grow-grow in understanding, grow in wisdom, grow in mutual respect and in compassion, and above all, to grow deeper in union with God.


I think the biggest challenge for Christian life is self-emptying, so also for religious life. The more we allow ourselves to be led and the more we fix our eyes on God, the happier we become, the freer we are to love, and the more capable we are to serve. That's more or less what I have been doing as a novice Sister--setting aside everything, to listen, to reflect and to respond to this loving God.

I look upon the religious vows as a confirmation of this inner development. Making it in public is a witness to God's love and glory. This is strengthened by living in community, sharing a common spirit of service and prayer. We take the vows of chastity, poverty, and obedience, each instructs a way of life. By living in chastity, we live in a loving and joyful way; by living in poverty, we strive to live our lives in a trusting and compassionate way; by the vow of obedience, we are to live in a listening and searching way.

Vocation is a gift from God, but "we have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us." (2Cor 4:7). Truly I know how unworthy I am, and can do nothing without the grace of our Lord.

What is a Synod?

The word "synod" evokes the image of "walking together on the way". For the Church it is a time-honoured way of working out together the "navigation map" for the Church at particular times. Synodality is about the whole People of God helping each other listen to what the Holy Spirit is saying to the Church. Pope Francis emphasises that this is not simply a matter of discussion as in a parliamentary debate. Rather it is primarily a prayerful spiritual time of communitarian discernment. It is about finding the best ways for every baptised person to fulfil the Church's mission of proclaiming to the world, God's love and salvation in Jesus Christ.

Pope Francis has emphasised that "It is precisely this path of Synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium". Synodality is at the heart of the pastoral conversion that Pope Francis emphasises in the Joy of the Gospel (Evangelii Gaudium).

When will the Synodal Assembly take place?

The journey towards a more Synodal Irish Church begins now, but preparing ourselves to think and act Synodally cannot happen overnight. A Synod without a Synodal preparation risks being merely a parliament of competing voices.

Can Synodal Assemblies change Church teaching?

Pope Benedict XVI, in an address to Pastoral Leaders in 2009, said that "They must no longer be viewed as "collaborators" of the clergy but truly recognised as "co-responsible" for the Church's being and action..." This model of "co-responsibility" has continued under the leadership of Pope Francis where he has encouraged the Church to be Synodal in its approach.

Much has been said of the model of Synodality being that of a "walking together" in a process of discernment, reflection and prayer trying to discover what God wants of the Church at this time. However, the question arises as to whether a Synodal Assembly can actually change Church teaching? Pope Francis has been clear that Synods are not instruments to change Church teaching but rather help to apply Church teaching more pastorally.
