THE Wreath

Today we light the first of our Advent candles. The traditional use of

Advent candles originated in eastern Germany prior to the Reformation. There are three purple candles and one pink candle. Purple for the royalty of the coming **King** the pink candle is the third candle to be lit on what is call **Gaudate Sunday** and represents 'joy'. The gradual lighting of the four candles symbolises the coming **Light** into the world. The wreath itself is also symbolic. The circle of evergreen in which the candles are placed represent everlasting life.

ABOUT ADVENT

The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." The focus of the season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent. Advent is far more than simply marking a 2,000 year old event in history. It is celebrating a truth about God, the revelation of God in Christ whereby all of creation might be reconciled to God.







You won't hear much about it on the television or radio and you won't read much about it in the newspapers, but he promised he would return and we believe it! We look forward to it just as people two thousand years ago looked forward the coming Messiah. We don't know exactly when he will come, it isn't marked on the calendar, but we are watching and waiting.

As we look prepare to celebrate the birthday of our Saviour, let's also be sure we are prepared for the day that he will come again.

Ireland's Lonely

An Irish pub's Christmas video of a lonely, old man has left people in tears. Viewers were "bawling" after watching the heart-wrenching video for Charlie's Bar in Enniskillen, Co. Fermanagh, which has gone viral with millions of views on TikTok. The commercial has also gained millions of views on X, formerly Twitter. The moving two-minute clip shows an elderly man bringing a bunch of flowers to a grave and looking heartbroken at the grave remembering loved ones. He then takes a walk through the town, tipping his cap to people passing by - but they walk on, too. Some are too enthralled in conversation, while others pretend not to notice him. The man arrives at Charlie's Bar on Church Street at the same time as a young couple with a little dog and they all go inside for a pint. As he sits down by the fire to drink his pint of Guinness by himself, the little dog comes over to greet him. This prompts the young couple to join the man at his table as they "cheers" to a new friendship. The heart-warming story concludes with a quote from Irish poet WB Yeats: "There are no strangers here, only friends you haven't yet met". Posting the advert on their Facebook page, Charlie's Bar wrote: "Christmas can be such a joyful time for some and painfully hard for others". "One thing is for sure - you'll always receive a warm welcome when you walk through our doors. We will be open on Christmas Day, so if you are alone this festive season, drop in for a chat." People flocked to share their thoughts on the magical scene, with some saying it perfectly captured the true spirit of Christmas. One social media user commented: "Far better than all the nonsense that assumes everyone has a huge family, bank account and social circle who meet up to eat vast amounts of food, play board games and pretend to embrace the nonsensical 'magic of Christmas'."

The survey was carried out as part of a European Parliament pilot project by the European Commission's Joint Research Centre (JRC) in collaboration with the Directorate General for Employment, Social Affairs & Inclusion (DG EMPL). Data on more than 20,000 Europeans was collected at the end of 2022 from an online consumer panel. It provides a detailed overview of loneliness in the European Union. Findings show that on average, 13% of respondents reported feeling lonely most or all of the time in 2022, while 35% reported being lonely at least some of the time. Loneliness prevalence differs across countries, this can be explained by cultural differences but also by demographic differences and, possibly, sampling differences.

According to the survey, loneliness is most prevalent in Ireland as over 20% of respondents reported feeling lonely. Luxemburg, Bulgaria, Greece followed behind while the lowest levels, all below 10%, are observed in the Netherlands, Czech Republic, Croatia and Austria.



A similar geographical pattern was already observed for data collected during the pandemic. The prevalence of loneliness decreased with increased age, income, and education. Having several meaningful relationships is associated with lower loneliness levels, but the frequency of contact also matters.

People experiencing major life events such as separation, job loss or finishing their studies are more often lonely. Evidence is also mixed on whether men or women are more likely to report being lonely. On average, women are more likely to be lonely, but when looking at gender differences by age, these differences are not statistically significant, according to the survey. Apart from age and gender, several other individual characteristics are found to be associated with loneliness. Previous studies found that the share of people who reported being lonely varied greatly by income level and work status. Richer respondents are less likely to be lonely than those in lower income areas loneliness is more prevalent among unemployed and students than among those who work. Education also matters, with higher education being negatively correlated with loneliness. Being in a relationship is associated with lower loneliness if individuals are happy in their relationship. Those in unhappy relationships are more likely to be lonely than single people. Consistently, individuals living with another adult are less likely to report loneliness compared to those living alone. Having a close relationship with several friends and family members not in the same household is also linked to a substantially lower risk of loneliness compared to having just one close contact or none. The frequency of contact with family members and friends also matters. Individuals who meet family members and friends at least once a week are less likely to be lonely. At least for family members, this also applies to exchanges via phone, the internet or social media. In this Season of good will, may we all make special effort to spend time with others.

This year we have spent €25,000 on education in our local community, this amount is made up from assisting our local primary and secondary schools where the principals have identified a need for support. As always, we assist our families who have children going into 3rd level education and the cost of accommodation and travel is hugely expensive. Any student who has not been successful in their SUSI application is welcome to contact us to discuss where we may be able to assist them.

We also work very closely with several local services in Portlaoise. We maintain a very good relationship with MABS, Treo Nua family Recourse Centre, Domestic Abuse Service, Bridge Street Community Mental Health Services, and the Parish Centre. We also assist several other services available to people in our community who may just need some help on an ad hoc basis.



An Advent Tradition for Church and Home:



THE ADVENT WREATH

We invite you to continue or start the tradition of having an Advent wreath in the home. The advent wreath has a rich meaning. The circle of the wreath, with no beginning or end, symbolises the eternity of God. The evergreen reminds us of the everlasting life we have in Christ while any pine cones or pods in the wreath represent new life and resurrection. The four candles represent the four Sundays of Advent. Purple is traditionally a colour of penance and prayer while the rose pink candle that is lit on the Third Sunday (Gaudete/Rejoice Sunday) marks our joy as we move ever closer to Christmas.

As you light a candle on your Advent wreath for the first time, pray this prayer of blessing and take a moment talk to God about how you will journey through Advent this year alone or as a household. Finish your time of prayer, again, with the Advent prayer: Come, Lord Jesus!

Loving God,

let your blessing come upon us as we light this wreath.

May it be a sign of hope for us as we prepare for your coming & may it turn our hearts to you in the days ahead.

Give us & the world your peace and love as we wait in joyful hope. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!

Weekly Advent Gospel Link

The First Sunday of Advent marks the start of Year B in the three-year cycle of Sunday readings in the Church. For the next year, on a Sunday we will hear mainly from the Gospel of Mark.

Today, as we step into the season of Advent, Mark's gospel urges us to 'Be on your guard, stay awake'. (Chapter 13, Verse 33)

This passage is a strong reminder to us to ready ourselves for the coming of the Lord, to be attentive for God at work in our world and in our lives, to take time to pray to God who in love will give us the strength to face our lives in confidence. With hope in the Lord, we believe that Jesus is coming to us all the time. While in our Mass we pray, 'we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ' we must be ready and prepared to welcome Him into our lives today. Are we ready to do this? Are we prepared to let Jesus into the 'stuff' of our lives, into all those corners where he can bring us the hope that comes from Him alone? What would that mean? What might that look

An Advent hymn to think about... O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

In many parishes the first sound of Advent is the singing of this traditional hymn. The text for the verses comes from what are known as the 'O antiphons' that are sung at Evening Prayer on the last days of Advent.

Sometime around the year 1100 an unknown author took these antiphons and turned them into a metrical Latin poem.

Eventually, an Anglican priest named John Mason Neale translated the Latin text into English. It was published in an 1853 hymnal by Thomas Helmore, using a 15th century French melody. From these origins we now have one of the most popular and well known Advent hymns.

The verses convey a plaintive mood of longing and yearning for God with each verse giving a name for Jesus that is full of hope. Notice how the petition of the verse is met by the joyful promise of the refrain – 'O Come, O come, Emmanuel...Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to you, O Israel'. In this Advent season we can call on God to come to us, knowing in faith, hope and joy that God answers us.

An Advent Household Prayer

We invite you take a moment each day in Advent to light your Advent wreath/ candle, to thank God for your Advent Day and to pray this prayer in union with the rest of our diocesan family, praying for peace in our world and in our lives.

Loving God, as your light grows in the dark of winter, bring its strength and its hope to the people of the Holy Land and to all people who suffer through war and conflict. Just as you sent the star of Bethlehem to lead the way to your Son, guide all people - leaders and citizens to follow your ways of peace and justice. As we remember the difficult journey of Mary and Joseph, may the Holy Family be a source of courage for each of us, helping us to reach out in friendship to the oppressed and displaced of this world. Help us to see in the Christ-child we welcome this Christmas, the one who came to bring an end to all divisions. Through Christ our Lord.

Amen.

And may the Lord bless us and keep us safe this Advent day and always.






