

Three Things To Do For Lent

Fasting and Abstinence:-

Keep your meals small and simple during Lent. This is not a slimming exercise. The thinking behind fasting and abstinence is that we strengthen our spiritual life by weakening physical pleasures. Fasting means reducing the amount of food that we would normally eat. Abstinence means not eating a particular food (meat). Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are to be observed as special days of Fasting and Abstinence.

Almsgiving:-

We are bombarded with requests for money from a huge number of charities. Identify a charity that means something to you ... find out what they do and make a contribution. If you can't afford to give money, give your time.

Prayer:-

Our lives are so hectic that we often forget to set aside a few quiet moments in which to talk to God. During Lent, postpone breakfast television for a few moments and make a short prayer. In the evening encourage your children to say a night time prayer before bed.

Dunamase College is holding its open evening on February 21st for students wishing to view the Aonad Lán Gaeilge and February 22nd for those wishing to take a tour of the English stream.

The Principal Dympna Kelly said, due to expansion works taking place last October, we had to postpone our Open Evening. We are very proud of our school and all the fantastic work that is done here, so we wanted to give students and parents the opportunity to view the facilities and find out what we have to offer here in Dunamase College.



Dunamase College has an Aonad Lán Ghaeilge, where



subjects are offered through the medium of Irish. Many of these students have previously attended Gaelscoileanna in the area, but the Aonad is open to students from the English medium primary schools also, with additional Irish language supports in place should they be required. The Aonad classes take place in the Railway Street building. Ms Kelly said that

"We play a pivotal role in keeping the Irish language alive in our community".

Digital technology is central to learning in Dunamase College and the school has embraced the opportunities offered by subjects such as Computer Science, Coding and Digital Media Literacy. Being a digital school there is a consciousness around the present and future role technology will play in the lives of their students. They are proud recipients of the European Digital Schools award. Two TY students, along with teachers Tomás Ó Murchú and Colin Waters, collaborated with LOETB schools in developing an action plan that focused on improving digital assessment.

Deputy Principal Claire Fitzgerald said: "By being a digital school the emphasis on collaboration and self-directed learning will be of great benefit to our students when they move on to third level and indeed the world of employment, as they will be ahead of their peers.

Dunamase College is constantly developing and adding to what is being offered to the students.

Dympna pointed out that "In a smaller school like ours, we know our students well and we believe in

fostering a sense of belonging and wellbeing." Dunamase College is the first school in Laois to be awarded the status of Champion School of Sanctuary. There is a strong sense of community within the school, and this is helped by the fact that the students are fortunate to have easy access to the facilities in the town. They often visit the Library, the Centre of Excellence and they have daily access to the Leisure Centre and the Astro pitch. This allows the school to offer an impressive array of sports, football, soccer, basketball, camogie, hurling and hockey.

In her role as Principal, Dympna is mindful of the ethos of "care, respect, equality, community and excellence in education" that is very important in the school, as it provides a holistic education for all who attend Dunamase College.



Hope for the Hopeless

Do you know what a bottle of medicine called calamine lotion is? Calamine is a medicine that is sometimes used to help stop itching. Have you have ever had the chicken pox? When you have chicken pox, it starts out like a cold - you feel lousy, have a runny nose, and run a fever. Then, all of a sudden, itchy red bumps start to break out all over your body. The itching drives you



crazy, but you can't scratch, because that just makes it worse. It is a very uncomfortable feeling, but it isn't hopeless. Rubbing on some calamine lotion may help to ease the itching. In a few days, the sores go away, the itching stops, and life is back to normal again.

During the time when Jesus lived upon the earth, leprosy was very wide-spread and was a dreaded disease. When someone had leprosy, they were covered with sores all over their bodies. Unlike chicken pox, these sores didn't just go away. When someone had leprosy, it was hopeless, because there was no cure. To make matters worse, other people considered them to be unclean and were not allowed to touch them. Many people believed that people who had leprosy got the disease because of some terrible sin they had committed.

One day a man with leprosy came to Jesus. The man knelt down before Jesus and said, "If you will, you can make me clean." Jesus looked at the man and he felt love and compassion for him. He reached out his hand and touched the man and said, "I am willing, be clean." Immediately, the leprosy left the man and he was cured.

Sometimes, we may find ourselves in a situation where we are uncomfortable, like when we had the chicken pox. But there may come a time in our lives when we find ourselves in a situation that is truly hopeless. When that happens, where can we turn? How do we find hope in a hopeless situation? We can turn to Jesus. When the situation is hopeless, Jesus is our only hope.



OUR PRAYER

Dear Father, you sent your Son to bring hope to the hopeless. When we find ourselves in a hopeless situation, we will put our hope and trust in him. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Lent begins Next Wednesday

Remember these are the three things we are asked to focus on for Lent.

Praying: Spend a little more time with God.

Sacrificing: Giving up something that you really like.

Almsgiving: Giving to those who have very little or sharing what you have with someone who needs it.



The Season of Lent

acts about Lent:

- Lent is a time when Christian people get ready for Easter.
- Lent is a sacred time within the Church calendar. It is a time of fasting, prayer and almsgiving.
- Lent lasts for forty days reminding us of the forty days that Jesus spent in the desert doing penance and fasting. It begins on Ash Wednesday (14th February 2024) and finishes before sunset on Holy Thursday. We don't count Sundays in the forty days because Sundays are days of celebration in the Church calendar.
- Purple vestments are worn by the priest during Lent.
- The Gloria and alleluia are not prayed at Mass during Lent.
- Lent comes for the word "lente" which means springtime.
- Many people promise to do something during Lent to help them to be more like Jesus. Sometimes they give up something they like, they fast from sweets, or television. Other people promise to do something like being kinder, going to Mass, saying prayers or to put money in the Trócaire box to remind them to help others who are not as lucky as they are.
- What we do during Lent helps us to get ready for Easter.

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is the First Day of Lent. On Ash Wednesday people are asked to fast. On Ash Wednesday the priest blesses the ashes and uses them to make the sign of the cross on our foreheads. The priest or minister says 'turn away form sin and be faithful to the Gospel', or similar words. Wearing ashes is a sign that a person is going to make an extra special effort during Lent to use his/her gifts for the good of others.



Working for a just world.



And Malita earns a living through farming and gathering firewood. Yet life is becoming harder, "The food I grow is only used for the family and it is not enough," she says.

"There are times we eat twice a day and times we eat only once."

Maybe during Lent, think about Malita and her family.

Time to Think!

Blessings on all who care for the sick

February 11th, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes and also World day of Prayer for the sick. Behind many hall-doors in our Parish and throughout the length and breadth of our Country, there are people who are sick; men and women, young and old; and more children than you might imagine. Some of them are confined to bed or to wheelchairs. Others, in spite of the limitations posed by their sickness, continue to go to work, do the shopping and play an active part in the life of their community. Each person's story is unique. Many of them are stories of great courage.

These days, when we think about healthcare, we often think of new technology and new drugs. These are important, but healthcare is first and foremost a relationship of trust. When people are sick, they often discover in a new and more profound way, how much they depend on others. It is a useful lesson for all of us to learn, even if we would hope not to have to become sick in order to do so. Part of the story of every sick person is that relationship of trust with family members, friends, neighbours, carers, nurses, doctors, radiographers, physiotherapists, ambulance crews, priests and ministers of Holy Communion. It is a relationship in which love is expressed in generous service and care.

The Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, if you are familiar with the story of the apparitions of Our Lady to Bernadette at Lourdes, you might wonder what the connection with healing is. It is true that Bernadette was not a very healthy child and Mary seems to have been very kind to her. Bernadette was not treated as an ignorant child from a poor family might expect to be treated. Mary spoke to her as a child of God. This reminds us, as Pope Francis says in his Message for this World Day of the Sick, that every person is, and always remains, a human being, and is to be treated as such. The sick and those who are deeply vulnerable, have their own inalienable dignity and mission in life.

I think, when Mary is present, Jesus is never far away. When she asks his help on our behalf, He listens to her. We see this when Jesus responds to the request of His Mother, to bring some joy back into the lives of the young couple at the Wedding Feast in Cana. The message of Lourdes, essentially, is that God loves us and that he comes to find us wherever we are, but especially in our weakness and in our smallness. The challenge of Lourdes is that we allow ourselves to be small, to be vulnerable and to receive whatever gift God wants to give us. In the years after the apparitions, Bernadette devoted her own life to prayer and the care of the sick, as a Sister of Charity of Nevers. She was never very healthy herself and she died of tuberculosis while she was still quite young. It may seem surprising that Bernadette never took the opportunity to return to Lourdes seeking a cure for her illness.

I think she realised that she had already been healed. Through her encounter with Mary the Mother of Jesus, her whole life had been changed. One of the things I have often noticed in Lourdes is that the sick bring healing to the healthy, through their attitude of patience and prayerfulness. Those who come to Lourdes in the whole of their health discover a new humility, and go home with a fresh appreciation of the gift of life. This is the kind of conversion that Mary spoke about to Bernadette. Miracles of physical healing do happen at Lourdes, but they are the "icing on the cake". The healing that comes from the love of God and of Mary His Mother touches people in many different ways.



It then overflows to touch the lives of others. It happens in a particular way in Lourdes, but it is not limited to Lourdes. It can happen in your home, in your hospital, or anywhere that people learn to see themselves and one another as the children of God.

I am very conscious that, in spite of all the good people who work in our healthcare system, the system itself is sick and in need of healing. Most people say that, once you get into the system, the care is very good, but getting in is a major problem. Many of you who work in hospitals and nursing homes, operate under enormous pressure and with facilities that don't always measure up to what is required. When the sick have to wait too long for treatment and when those who care for the sick themselves become sick from stress, it is perfectly reasonable to feel angry. But it is important that we don't take our anger out on one another. In this situation too, it is love that heals. Anger is an energy that, with wisdom and love, can be converted into a power which changes structures. As we pray for those who are sick, and for those who care for the sick, let us pray, especially today, for the wisdom to know how to bring that gift of healing to the healthcare system itself. Our local Hospital in Portlaoise, Kilkenny and indeed community hospitals are an essential service and an essential lifesaving one, which must never be compromised.

One of the most profound statements made by Jesus, was "I have come not for the healthy but for the sick". Jesus had a powerful empathy and courageous outreach, to those who longed for healing. His love touched the wounds of the leper, his presence, brought Peace of Mind to many overwhelmed by anxiety and mental illness. God's presence, to those who carry burdens physical, spiritual, emotional is truly one that can offer healing and transformation. All of us carry strengths and weakness, we are all marked by the vicissitudes of our life story. Empathy is the ability to reach out and connect with love to others. I pray in a special way for all who care for the sick. Carers in the family context who provide selfless and constant attention to vulnerable people are the true heroes in Irish society.

"Take my hand O Blessed Mother, Hold me firmly lest I fall, I am nervous when I am walking, and to thee I humbly call. Guide me over every crossing, Watch me when I am on my way, Let me know you are beside me, Listen to my frequent prayers. Bring me to my destination, safely every single day, Help me with my understanding, as the hours pass away. And when evening falls upon me, and I fear to be alone, Take my hand O Blessed Mother, and once again guide me home".





At 10am Mass today (Sunday 11th Feb.) Bishop Denis will celebrate Mass and rededicate Holy Cross Church Ratheniska. Dating back to 1800 this Church has served the Ratheniska area of our parish for 224 years. It is the oldest of our three Churches in the parish and the last to be refurbished. Please God the recent works will ensure the future of the building and its service as a Church for decades and even centuries to come. The work included a new roof, new Altar furnishings, new heating system, complete renewal of electrical services, an extension to the Sacristy enabling a space for Altar servers and a more dignified entry to the Church for the celebrant.

We are very grateful to AOCA, and particularly Pamela Weldon, who served as engineers and project managers for the work. To Pat McBride Construction and his team and sub-contractors for the building works; Glen O'Shaughnessy, Portlaoise Gas & Oil for new underfloor air to water, heating system; John Cahill Electrical; James Hackett for sound system: Acton BV for webcam and streaming services: ICS (Irish Contract Seating) for the refurbishing of the pews; Terry Swayne of Portlaoise Stone Centre, for the new floor and the handling and placing of the Altar, Ambo and Reredos (the Altar is over 3 ton weight). Special thanks to the Mercy Sisters for the Sanctuary furnishings (Altar, Ambo, Reredos, Tabernacle and Cross), originally placed in the nun's chapel, Templemore which was being decommissioned. These are works by the late artist Richard Enda King and fit beautifully into Holy Cross Church.
