Giving Our All

Jesus sits down opposite the treasury, and watches the crowd putting money into the collecting boxes. Many rich people put in large generous looking sums, but nevertheless large sums that they can easily afford.

Then along comes a poor widow and puts in two small copper coins, doubtless all she has. Jesus points out that because she has given her all, her contribution is worth far more than the rich people's contribution. Jesus teaches us a difficult lesson in generosity.

We have to give until it hurts, whether it's a giving of our money or of our time and energy. If we only give a small part of ourselves then the question we have to ask is, what is it that we are holding back, and more importantly, why? Do we only give a fraction of our resources because we lack faith? Do we hold back from giving because we imagine that the money we give might not reach its intended destination, or that it might not make any difference? Do we hold back because we lack empathy, or have become immune to the plight of the disadvantaged? Do we hold back because we feel we have better ways to spend our money and our time? Do we hold back because we imagine there are plenty of other people better fixed to help out than us? Or do we simply hold back because we feel our own needs should come first?

It would be useful if God advised exactly what percentage of our money and time we should give, but the only clue we are given in today's gospel is that we are judged not by our outward show of generosity, but by what is in our hearts.

Supporting the Parish

We have got used to not passing 'the baskets' for the Offertory and Development fund collections and would like to be able to establish this as the way forward. We can do that because of your generous support and please God that will continue. Elsewhere in the Link Up the various ways to support the parish is outlined. You choose - we feel this is a more adult way of dealing with each other in the matter of supporting the Parish. As St. Paul tells us 'each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver' (2Cor.9:7). We are grateful to those who support us and encourage everyone to play their part. How the money is spent is outlined in our annual accounts published on the previous page and also in the work to our Churches and other parish properties. All due to your support!

Payments to priests:

Collections for the support of the priests are separate from payments made to Parish Funds. There are 4 collections for the support of the Priests taken up during the year. Christmas, Lent, Easter, and October. They are lodged to the Parish Clergy Fund from which the priests are paid an agreed salary. If there is a surplus in the Clergy Fund at the end of the year (which invariably there is) it goes to the Diocesan Retired Priest Fund. The priests thank you for your continued generous support.

Parish Centre:

The Parish Centre is at the heart of the Parish and its services are vital to our vibrant parish. Like many organisations and hospitality operations it has experienced the effects of the pandemic, inflation and reduced income. The 2023 accounts show a deficit of €69,000 in its running costs. It has taken a long time to recover from the damaging effects of the Pandemic. But in recent months it has been as busy with meetings and functions etc. as it has ever been. So we look forward to reducing that deficit in this current year. The Link Up, which prints 2,800 copies each week, contributes to the deficit - efforts will be made to bridge this gap.

Parish Lotto:

The Parish Lotto, our regular weekly fund raiser, continues to be a very important contributor to the financial wellbeing of the Parish. Our thanks to all who support it and a special 'thank you' to our promoters. It has a very attractive prize fund structure. Yearly and half yearly membership gift cards are available at the Parish Centre. An ideal gift for Christmas, birthdays etc. You may also participate on-line via our website.

Our Parish:

I take this opportunity to thank the many people who help to sustain Portlaoise Parish. Our generous parishioners and contributors; our Lotto promoters and members; our parish staff — those employed by the parish as well as our community employment scheme personnel and volunteers. We are truly blessed in the support and good will we experience. Long may it continue.
